

Circle of Support: Women Under God's Protection

Even as Michigan's COVID-19 cases reach 113,000 and the number of deaths continues to rise, the hope of life abounds when this new group of immigrant women gather to be in solidarity through the pain and needs that arise in the pandemic.

When one woman received help from Strangers No Longer this spring, she sparked a desire to reach more women with such support. This led to the formation of a group of women, who now gather virtually every three weeks to share how we are affected by the pandemic, and by our stories of immigration. One group member led us in sharing about the impact the virus has on our children. Another desired to know more deeply the other women, and so invited us to share why we came to the US and how we arrived here. It was a very emotional meeting, and our respectful listening and empathy allowed us to trust each other and share more vulnerably.

We all consider this Circle of Support to be a space in which we, the women, can openly express our feelings. We believe this Circle is our method of communication and our outlet for the day-to-day problems we face as immigrant women. Though in this pandemic we risk our lives daily going out to work to feed our families, it is our faith in Jesus Christ that gives us strength and courage to keep fighting for our families and loved ones. Our faith in Jesus is an example for our children – both those born in this country or brought here at a young age. It is our sons and daughters who push us to be better people every day.

This is why we believe we are a group of women extraordinarily determined, brave, and most importantly, full of faith. This faith that moves mountains has given us the courage to cross the border and build a life in the US. This is the faith that makes us who we are!
