These events will explore topics relevant to queer business owners and professionals in urban Saskatchewan, with a primary focus on Regina, Saskatoon, and Prince Albert.

#### **About Saskatchewan Queer Entrepreneurs & Professionals (SQEP)**

Saskatchewan Queer Entrepreneurs & Professionals (SQEP) is an association of queer, trans, and allied business owners and professionals in Saskatchewan. As a provincial chapter of the CGLCC: Canada's 2SLGBTQI+ Chamber of Commerce, our mission is to foster a vibrant and inclusive ecosystem that empowers, connects, and uplifts queer people in business and professional sectors in Saskatchewan.

We accomplish our mission through:

- Providing opportunities for queer and trans people to network and collaborate in business and professional spaces;
- Advocating for the recognition, equal treatment and celebration of queer and trans entrepreneurs and professionals in Saskatchewan; and
- Engaging with member businesses, local organizations and government through events, partnerships and diverse initiatives that promote understanding, acceptance, and support for the Saskatchewan queer community in business and in the workplace.

# **Background Information**

### **Services to be Provided**

Chosen panelists will be expected to participate in a facilitated panel discussion alongside others with similar areas of expertise or experience. Panelists will receive discussion questions in advance and should come prepared to share insights related to their field and its relevance to business or 2SLGBTQI+ identity. Each panel will include a brief Q&A session with audience members. Panelists may also have the opportunity to take part in facilitated networking experiences as part of the event.
