




Sector Capacity Building in the Wraparound Service Delivery Model for Newcomer Youth

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Regional 5-year initiative led by Centre for Newcomers that seeks to develop sector capacity in the use of the wraparound service delivery model which will standardize and coordinate service delivery for newcomer youth. The project is funded by Immigration, Refugee and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) and will work with settlement and non-settlement agencies across IRCC's PNT Region (Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and the Northwest Territories) to build organizational capacity in the use and implementation of wraparound service delivery for newcomer youth.

The project will put learning into action. Processes and programs will be informed by lived experience of newcomer youth to ensure they feel welcomed and successful in their life in Canada. The use of the wraparound process as a tool will help achieve this goal by allowing youth and partners to reflect and evaluate on their own responses to newcomer youth settlement, allowing for modification of practices where, and when, needed.
