BELFAST ROTARY HARBOR FEST AUGUST 19-21 FEATURES BOATBUILDING, RACES, FOOD AND MORE

Belfast Rotary Club's 15th annual Harbor Fest Friday, Aug. 19, Saturday, Aug. 20 and Sunday, Aug. 21, will fill the Belfast waterfront with a live and silent benefit auction kicking off the event on Friday evening at the new United Farmers Market building on Front Street.

The free three-day celebration of the city's maritime history and traditions will include the National Boatbuilding Challenge competition, this year with \$1,750 in cash prizes, a harborside exhibit of classic boats, tours of the Front Street Shipyard, the Come Boating! rowing regatta, the 5K "Bug Run" road race, a blueberry pancake breakfast, live music, food trucks, children's activities and the popular Sunday morning Cardboard Boat Race.

"Belfast Harbor Fest is back, bigger and better than ever," said the Rotary Club event's long-time chairperson Duke Marston. "As many as eight National Boatbuilding Challenge teams will be competing for a \$1,000 first prize. Touch-A-Truck is back, as are kids activities, the Boat Gear Swap and blueberry pancake breakfast and Cardboard Boat Race. Harbor Fest is a celebration for Belfast and anyone who is here during the event. Rotary is sure everyone will have a very good time."

The live and silent "Evening By the Bay" auctions begin at 5:30 at the new United Farmers Market building at 15 Front Street. This year's auctions, proceeds of which will benefit the Waldo County Technical Center's student fund, feature restaurant and experiential gift certificates, and artwork including Sandy Dolan's original oil painting "Summer Breeze," the 2022 Harbor Fest's chosen graphic.

Saturday is anchored by the National Boatbuilding Challenge, beginning at 11 a.m. Pairs of builders race the clock and each other to finish and race 12-foot skiffs built from scratch in less than four hours. Cash prizes of \$1,000, \$500 and \$250 are sponsored by John and Pat Carrick, Mathews Brothers and an anonymous donor. Boatbuilding starts after the 5K "Bug Run" race (sponsored by First National Bank and First National Wealth Management) starting on the hill above Steamboat Landing and ending at the Boathouse where the blueberry pancake breakfast will be held (sponsored by Nordic Aquafarms). Saturday is also the day for free Front Street Shipyard tours at 11 a.m. and noon. An all-day Adventure Boat and Outdoor Equipment Show, Come Boating!'s 21st annual harbor rowing regatta, music at the Steamboat Landing gazebo, food trucks and children's activities.

Belfast Harbor Fest concludes Sunday morning with the Cardboard Boat Race (sponsored by Front Street Shipyard), complete with the always popular "Best Sinking" award, followed by a lobster bake gala to benefit Waldo County Habitat for Humanity.
