

CONGRATULATIONS ON JOINING THE CHURCH!













Dear Friends:

I hope that you have a happy November. We're going to begin November with an acknowledgement of All Saints Sunday on November 5th. On November 19th, we'll celebrate Thanksgiving together, and then we'll move to Advent.

Advent at Bel Air UMC

Advent begins November 26th! If you look at the liturgical calendar, you'll see that Advent doesn't begin until December 3rd. I made the decision to move it up a week early. This was to give us an extra week to celebrate Advent without it impinging upon December 24th, which will be Christmas Eve. So, come celebrate with us, and help us make it a great season. Our sermon series for this season will be based on the book "Experiencing Christmas, Christ in the Sights and Sounds of Advent," by Matt Rawle.

Pastor Byron's Sabbatical Plans

I hope to apply for a sabbatical through the Lilly Foundation. The Lilly Foundation is a private organization that offers funding for sabbaticals and other philanthropic purposes, which are consistent with their mission. If approved, I hope to be on a sabbatical sometime this next summer. One of the things that I'd like to do is hike the Via Franchigena, an ancient pilgrimage between Canterbury Cathedral in England and The Vatican in Rome, Italy. Via Franchigena means The Way Through France in Italian. It's named after Sigeric, the Archbishop of Canterbury, after he made the pilgrimage to Rome in the year 990 A.D.

After meeting with the SPRC, Staff-Parish Relations Committee, I believe that it would be less disruptive to church plans for me to split up my sabbatical over two years. The foundation recommends 3-6 months for a sabbatical. I would like to apply for four months total, split up over 2024 and 2025. Can I do the walk after my stroke? I don't know. I won't really know what I'm capable of physically until I try it, but I intend to begin training soon. I feel good physically, but I know that the pilgrimage will take a toll on my body. Many people have asked me, "Do you have an emergency plan?" No, not yet. But I intend to have one before I walk.

Much is up in the air at this point. It's only an idea, but an idea that gets more real once I apply for the funding and the concept. It's something that I'd like to do, but I don't know if I'll get approved or not. The Lilly Foundation is a very competitive organization and they only approve the best applications.

Would this cost BAUMC anything? No. If I get approved, the funding is covered, and I won't incur any costs to BAUMC. I'm not supposed to communicate with the church while I'm on the sabbatical, but I can communicate as much as I'd like, or as much as you'd like to hear, before and afterwards. I will keep you posted on my application status. The idea has been approved by our SPRC and our Administrative Council. Now, the rest will be up to God, my physical strength, and the Lilly Foundation. We will see.





Monday – Friday Weekdays:

If Harford County Public Schools are closed all day due to inclement weather, all church programs and activities will be canceled.

If there is a school opening delay, all church programs and activities scheduled during the delay will be canceled. Any programs scheduled after the delay will be held as planned.

Evenings and Weekends:

In the event schools close early or cancel weekday evening activities due to inclement weather, please check the BAUMC website, FaceBook page or call the office for the latest information.

For weekend activities, please check the BAUMC website or FaceBook page for the latest information.

Sunday Worship Services:

Sunday worship services are generally not cancelled, however, in the event of severe weather, please check the BAUMC website or FaceBook page for the latest information.

Ways to Stay informed:

The fastest way to get weather closing information is through social media sites and by opting in our texting service. **Text CLOSING to 410-210-4363 to opt in to our texting service.**

Check Bel Air UMC social media sites, Facebook or www.belairumc.org for the most current updates on church. (If you have Facebook, "like" us and "follow" us to get the most up-to-date information.)

In some cases, emergency messages such as weather closings will be broadcast through phone texts. Because of high volume of traffic through phone carriers, these messages are often delayed. Therefore, we encourage you to check social media sites and websites for the most updated information.

Homestead Update

The Homestead house went on the market June 14th. It was shown 35 times from mid-June until early September when BAUMC received an offer and a contract ratified on September 6th. A 14-day period for inspections has passed, and a closing date of October 31st has been set. Good news there. What I can share about the buyer is that he is interested in renovating and living in the house with his family. Probably one of the more favorable



outcomes, restoring the noble house and making it a family home.

Regarding progress on the sales of the four lots. BAUMC has a Lot Purchase Agreement in place with Ward Communities (Bob Ward Homes). It has taken longer than anticipated to complete the requirements necessary to go to settlement. However, we are nearing the completion and have December 15th as the date scheduled to settle on the sale of those lots.

Once again thank you for your support and patience in this process. We are nearing completion of the sale of the Homestead house and property.
