

### LENT


Lent is upon us. It begins with Ash Wednesday, Wednesday, March 5th this year. For some of us, it begins just before that, after all the pancakes and sausage have been served. We have a Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper here at the church each year, and you're invited. We also have several Ash Wednesday options. There's a Manna House service at 11:00 am. We'll be at the door at the Linwood Circle again this year for drive-thru ashes from 12-1 pm. And then there will be a Come As You Are Service in McComas Hall at 7:15 pm. Come as you're able to come.

There's a quote about Lent that I like from Barbara Brown Taylor. She says, "We do no head straight to Easter from the spa or shopping mall. Instead, we are invited to spend forty days examining the nature of our own covenant with God. Upon what does that relationship depend? What do we trust to give us life?"

Lent is 40-days of spiritual preparation for Easter. It's often a time of fasting, prayer, meditation, self-denial, and solitude. There may not be any cheering from friends and neighbors. There certainly won't be any cheering from the culture around us. This time is completely counter-cultural. But, I invite you to consider this time anyway as an opportunity to renew your relationship with God.

During Lent, there will be a "Soup and Study" on Wednesday evenings from 6:15-7:15 pm in Room 202. Once again, come as you are. We'll be using the book, The Message of Jesus, by Adam Hamilton. It felt like a good follow up to our January and February preaching series on Jesus as Friend, Teacher, Savior, Lord, Way, and Presence. We have books here at the church office, or you may order you own through your favorite distributor. Books here at the church are \$12. Please feel to purchase one, or simply just come to the study and join in. We'd love to hear from you whether you have a book or not.





We are offering this training so the congregation knows what to do in the event of an emergency.




### **Prayer Shawl Ministry**

We meet for work, inspirational messages, prayer, fellowship and fun. We make prayer shawls, comfort blankets, and pocket prayer squares to comfort people in need. They are made for the purpose of reaching out to others in Jesus' name, to let them know they are cared about, prayed for and loved. Wrapping oneself in a prayer shawl or blanket is a way to feel God's loving arms surrounding you with warmth and comfort. Carrying a mini prayer square in your pocket or purse is a tangible reminder that God is with us, in good times and bad.

### BAUMC High School Graduating Senior Scholarship

The Bel Air United Methodist Church Involvement College Scholarship is offered to high school seniors who are members of the church and who will be entering the first year of college in Fall 2025. Scholarship applications are reviewed and evaluated on three criteria – academic achievement, community and church involvement, and letters of recommendation. This scholarship award began in 1980 through a gift from Ben and Rachel Tobin, and donations from members and friends of BAUMC fund the scholarships awarded each spring.

The United Methodist Book of Discipline charges the Ad Council to "provide for planning and implementing a program of nurture, outreach, witness and resources in the local church". In her sermon last Sunday, Pastor Lynn asked us how we "live the Way of Jesus in our lives". The incredible impact of our ministries, missions, small groups and Bible study groups in no small part help us "live the Way" here at BAUMC.

So, one of the major Ad Council goals we envision for 2025 is to help our ministries, missions, small groups and Bible study groups reach the congregation in a more personal way. We are creating a "Spotlight On" bulletin board (look for it soon in the Welcome area), designed to help get the word out about what's happening in your ministry, mission, small group or Bible study group. You can use your creativity to share your wonderful group with the congregation...pictures, testimonies, stories, events, next steps, etc. And if you'd like, you can occasionally hang out by the bulletin board to interact with folks on Sundays after church service when they come to check it out. The ministry works to assist people in the community who are facing BGE shut offs. A recent visit on a Monday morning while the ministry was in action led to a discussion about the type of help needed. They assured us that they work with each volunteer's comfort zone, are flexible with scheduling, and said they could really use clerical help. Picking up phone messages, checking e-mails, checking applications for eligibility, helping maintain the data base of those who have gotten assistance in the past year...volunteers that could do any or all these things would be invaluable. And if you would like to make calls and interact directly with folks coming in for assistance you can, but it's not necessary. The ministry operates on Mondays from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm. If you can help, please contact Pastor Byron. (You can arrange to stop by on a Monday to check them out if you'd like to see exactly what they do, but please let them know ahead of time).
