Dear friends,

Every Sunday since I have been here there are new faces and attendance continues to steadily climb. There is a buzz and excitement and dare I say, a growing confidence. People are stepping up to give sacrificially, to make time available to help and to invite friends and neighbors.

For me, and I think I can speak on behalf of the entire staff team, it truly is a great joy to serve St. Francis at this time. My wife Lucy will be here with me for our first Louisville Christmas. So, it will be two voices at least wishing you not Happy Holidays but truly a Happy Christmas!

Everyone is urged to add one or more of these offerings to your Advent discipline.


Sunday Morning Advent Bible Study

Speaker: William F. Cook, III

Professor of New Testament Interpretation, Southern Seminary

Prior to coming to Southern Seminary, Mr. Cook was associate professor of New Testament and chair of the theology division at Florida Baptist Theological College, where he taught for nine years. He is the author of several articles and numerous book reviews as well as a commentary titled *John: Jesus Christ*

is God. Mr. Cook has served as a pastor and interim pastor in Louisiana, Alabama, and Florida, and he is a popular Bible conference preacher. He is a member of the Evangelical Theological Society. Mr. Cook currently serves as the Lead Pastor at Ninth and O Baptist Church in Louisville, KY.



Wednesday, December 12 at 6:30 p.m.

Speaker: Martha Kaster

After receiving her BA from Franklin & Marshal College in 1990, Rev. Kaster worked for the Fellowship of Christian in Universities and Schools (FOCUS) for 8 years before going into the discernment process with the Diocese of Central Florida. She was the lay chaplain at St. Edward's Episcopal School for 2 years before attending Trinity Episcopal School for Ministry

(TESM). She received a MDiv from TESM in 2006 and was hired as the Assistant Priest at St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Des Moines, and was also direct commissioned into the US Army in order to become a Chaplain—fully accessioned as a Chaplain in the Iowa Army National Guard in January 2009. She was deployed to Afghanistan as a Battalion Chaplain for the Infantry from 2010-11 and later was installed as the Rector of St. Luke's. She continues to serve in the parish as well as the Brigade Chaplain for the 2/34th Infantry Brigade Combat Team within the Iowa National Guard.



Wednesday, December 19 at 6:30 p.m.

Speaker: Richard Gwathmey

Mr. Gwathmey attended the University of Virginia for college and law school, after which he practiced law in New York City. There he encountered the ministry of FOCUS (Fellowship of Christians in Universities and Schools), a para-church ministry primarily to teenagers in independent schools in the Northeast. He left the practice of law and went to work for FOCUS in

1978, holding various positions on and off until 2016. It was at FOCUS that he met Simon Barnes (who became his boss). Mr. Gwathmey is a friend of Simon's and was best man in Simon and Lucy's wedding.

Metro Christian Legal Aid will hold an Expungement Clinic, **Saturday**, **January 19, 2019 from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m.** at Loaves & Fishes Ministry, 500 E. Caldwell St. (40203). This will be the first in a series of legal clinics to be held at Loaves & Fishes on the third Saturday of each month. Regular monthly clinics will provide clients with free legal counseling on civil legal issues. Volunteers are needed in January and for future clinics for the following work:

- to greet clients,
- to help with paperwork,
- to input data,
- to provide legal counsel,
- to provide spiritual counsel, and to pray with clients.

Metro Christian Legal Aid is a 501(c)3 organization that exists to show the love of God to our neighbors by providing Christ-centered legal aid and education, and to advance access to justice in the community. MCLA is opening the clinic in partnership with St. Francis and Loaves & Fishes, Inc.

The process for calling the next Rector of St. Francis in the Fields

Recognizing that the parish has not gone through a true Rector search in its entire 70-plus year history and reflecting the current climate that exists in the church family with regard to the prior administration, the following process has now been approved by the Bishop of Kentucky (together with the Cannon

to the Ordinary) and the Bishop of Central Florida, and by unanimous vote of the Vestry.

- * While it is normal within cannons of the Diocese for the terms of office for the Vestry to be suspended for the full term of the interim, in recognition that the process and therefore the interim may extend over a year; it is agreed that the Vestry terms of office be suspended for only one year. That normal Vestry elections and terms of office are reinstated after that period.
- * That the discernment committee be constituted in the following way: Chairman, either the Senior or Junior Warden to be chosen between themselves. Tim Root was chosen and unanimously approved by the Vestry. Vestry membership, two members duly elected by closed ballot. Congregational membership, four members duly elected by closed ballot (one of whom should be between 16 and 18 years of age). Staff membership, one member excluding interim staff, duly elected by closed ballot (yet to be confirmed by Bishop's office).
- * That the chosen Chairman (Tim Root) and others of his choosing work (in conjunction with the Canon to the Ordinary) to determine when the process of parish discernment and reflection on the past, including a time of listening and reflective profiling, is complete. At such a time the election of members of the committee from each constituent part shall be called and the committee duly formed.
- * Once the committee is formed and the work underway, a strict code of confidentiality will be maintained regarding all aspects of the committee work. The interim Rector acting as Chaplain will offer the sole communication channel to the Vestry and parish.
- * When a candidate has been unanimously approved (by closed ballot) of the discernment committee the candidate will be presented to the Bishop of Kentucky (and as a courtesy the Bishop of Central Florida) for approval.
- * Once approved the Vestry will be presented with the candidate for approval and once approved staff and then congregation will be informed as to the name of the person chosen to lead the parish as the new Rector.
- * The Interim Rector will remain in post until such time as determined by the Vestry as necessary depending on the length of lead time needed for the new Rector to take office.

The process will include a profile of St. Francis in the Fields, which will be in two parts. Part A will be a "looking back" and Part B will be "looking forward". Part A has started with the conversations that Fr. Barnes has been conducting and the Vestry has participated in a discussion/exercise of looking back at our recent and long-term history. The next item related to looking back will be to engage the staff and the full congregation. Our hope is to engage the full congregation with a survey by the end of the year. After all of this is completed, we will move to the process of selecting the full Search Committee. Detailed information on committee member selection will be communicated to everyone at a later date. After the committee is in place, work will begin on Part B / "looking forward". The looking forward process will also involve a wide range of engagement with everyone. When both parts of our profile are completed it will be added to information about our church programs, staff, facilities, etc. and the solicitation of candidates will begin. Please know that throughout the entirety of the search process, it will be the goal of the search committee to communicate and update everyone as regularly as we are able to.

With all of us working together, and the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we will move into an exciting future and continue the work of spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Praying you and your families have a safe and blessed Christmas season.

Israel Pilgrimage 2018 by Donna Burdette

On October 31, more than 25 members of St. Francis in the Fields, plus several others, set off on a pilgrimage to Israel. After a few flights, we arrived in Tel Aviv on Thursday, November 1 and began a 10 day life-changing adventure.

This was a study-pilgrimage. Scripture was tied into every place we went. There are too many places to mention, but some of the highlights included exploring the desert region of the Negev, where we visited a Bedouin camp and rode camels, swimming (floating) in the Dead Sea, riding a cable car to Masada (Herod the Great's fortress palace in the desert), Baptisms (reaffirming) in the Sea of Galilee, along with visiting and learning all about the cities of Capernaum,

Bethlehem, Nazareth, and Jerusalem, and everywhere in between.

In Jerusalem, we were at the Mount of Olives, Gethsemane, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, the Holocaust Museum, and were invited to sing at St. Anne's Church. The Western Wall was a prayerful time with each of us adding our own prayers to all those prayers previously written out and placed within the Wall. This was a very spiritual and emotional experience for everyone. On the last day of the trip, while in Jerusalem, we attended a beautiful service at Christ Church and then played the tourist and shopped in the Old City where many of us learned the art of bargaining. We ate dinner at a modern Jerusalem restaurant and then prepared for our trip home.

We all agreed that the Bible would definitely become more alive as we had now been to so many of the places we've been studying and reading about. It was most comforting, encouraging and uplifting for all of us to know you were praying for us and our safety while on this trip. We were blessed with good travel weather and good health, in addition to open minds for receiving all that we had been taught. I can't encourage you enough to take this trip if you ever have the chance.

Brotherhood of St. Andrew members take fieldtrip to the Backside at Churchill Downs

On a Monday evening in November, after the Breeder's Cup weekend at Churchill Downs, the St. Francis Chapter of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew worked together to serve a meal. Horseracing tracks are places where you can find the wealthiest of the wealthy and the poorest of the poor. There are hundreds of very important jobs taking care of these million -dollar horses. The backside workers live in college-type dorm rooms around the barns and are up before the sun cleaning and mucking stalls, hot walking the horses and any other menial tasks. There are many things to do, and these folks get paid near nothing, and when the racing is done at one track they move on to the next either in Louisiana, Florida, California, or any track where they can find work. Many are married and have children.

The offering the Brotherhood was able to do last month was a hot meal—and plenty of it. They were served fried chicken, green beans, baked beans, potato salad and a pile of cookies. All were fed and the remainder went to our church partner, Loaves & Fishes, Inc. Curtis and his volunteers in turn prepared meals for the homeless, just like they do every week.

The whole experience of feeding the workers at the Backside will be repeated twice each calendar year by our chapter, as we have done for the last 12 years. We love serving and it is very rewarding to see the happy faces enjoying their meal. This year, there were more people to be fed, due to the proximity of the Breeders Cup events.

This continuing effort, has been a heart-warming one for us to participate in. The food, and the camaraderie that is present, has been extremely well received by the workers, as well as the staff of Christ Chapel in the Backside itself.

On September 23, St. Francis in the Fields hosted a "Build-A-Bed" event in Graves Hall. It was an amazing event where people of all ages came together to build beds for children in Jefferson County that do not have a place to sleep. The Saturday before the event we had members of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew and youth from our church gathering in the courtyard to sand the wood so no child would get a splinter. The noise from the power sanders was like a beehive on steroids! Amazingly, a job we thought would take hours was completed in an hour and a half!

The next day we had over 100 people gather after church services to assemble the beds. After enjoying a lovely luncheon donated by the Brotherhood of St. Andrew and the Daughters of the King, Ben Langley gave us instructions and prayed. Our motto was, "Team-work makes the Build a Bed Dream Work!" We had 5 teams of 10 volunteers working together on assembling beds, we had 30 people decorating bed slates with inspirational messages, and we had 2 wrap stations and a loading crew. In a few short hours we built 30 beds for school-aged children our community.

The next day we were able to deliver the donations of the beds and a "bedtime bag" which had a pillow, a set of sheets, a homemade quilt, a blanket, a teddy bear, a bedtime story, new toothpaste and toothbrush, and a wall-art decoration to the participating schools.

Thank you to all the people who donated their time, talent and treasure to make our Build a Bed project a blessing to our community!
