

Moses the Prophet & Godseer



The Prophet Moses—whose name means "one who draws forth," or "is drawn from," that is, from the water—was the pinnacle of the lovers of wisdom, the supremely wise lawgiver, the most ancient historian of all. He was of the tribe of Levi, the son of Amram and Jochabed (Num. 26:59). He was born in Egypt in the seventeenth century before Christ. While yet a babe of three months, he was placed in a basket made of papyrus and covered with pitch, and cast into the streams of the Nile for fear of Pharaoh's decree to the mid-wives of the Hebrews, that all the male children of the Hebrews be put to death. He was taken up from the river by Pharaoh's daughter, became her adopted son, and was reared and dwelt in the King's palace for forty years. Afterward, when he was some sixty years old, he fled to Madian, where, on Mount Horeb, he saw the vision of the burning bush. Thus he was ordained by God to lead Israel and bring it out of the land of Egypt. He led Israel through the Red Sea as it were dry land and governed the people for forty years. He wrought many signs and wonders, and wrote the first five books of the Old Testament, which are called the Pentateuch. When he reached the land of Moab, he ascended Mount Nabau, on the peak called Phasga, and there, by divine command, he reposed in the sixteenth century before Christ, having lived for some 120 years. The first two Odes of the Old Testament, "Let us sing to the Lord" and "Attend, O heaven, and I will speak," were written by him. Of these hymns, the first was chanted by the shore of the Red Sea as soon as the Israelites had crossed it; the second, in the land of Moab, a few days before his repose. The Holy High Priest Aaron was the elder brother of the Holy Prophet Moses. He was appointed by God to serve as the spokesman of Moses before the people, and also before Pharaoh, in Egypt. Afterwards, in the wilderness, he was called to the ministry of the high priesthood, as narrated in the books of Exodus, Leviticus, and Numbers in the Old Testament. The name Aaron means "enlightened."

Resurrectional Apolytikion 3rd Tone

Let the heavens sing for joy, and let everything on earth be glad. * For with His Arm the Lord has worked power. * He trampled death under foot by means of death; * and He became the firstborn from the dead. * From the maw of Hades He delivered us; * and He granted the world His great mercy.

Apolytikion for Hieromartyr Babylas 4th Tone

As a sharer of the ways and a successor to the throne of the Apostles, O inspired of God, thou foundest discipline to be a means of ascent to divine vision. Wherefore, having rightly divided the word of truth, thou didst also contest for the Faith even unto blood, O Hieromartyr Babylas. Intercede with Christ our God that our souls be saved.

Apolytikion for the Church 4th Tone

As first called of the Apostles and brother of Peter the Preeminent, O Andrew, intercede with the Master of all to grant peace to the whole world, and great mercy to our souls.

Seasonal Kontakion 4th Tone

In your holy birth, Immaculate One, Joachim and Anna were rid of the shame of childlessness; Adam and Eve of the corruption of death. And so your people, free of the guilt of their sins, celebrate crying: "The barren one gives birth to the Theotokos, who nourishes our life."



St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 15:1-11

Brethren, I would remind you in what terms I preached to you the gospel, which you received, in which you stand, by which you are saved, if you hold it fast -- unless you believed in vain. For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God which is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed.



Again I tell you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God." When the disciples heard this they were greatly astonished, saying, "Who then can be saved?" But Jesus looked at them and said to them, "With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

Translation of Greek Sermon

Beloved in Christ,

Sometimes, it feels as though life is stacked against us. It feels as though we cannot win no matter how hard we try. In today's Gospel Passage, the Lord says to the disciples that it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven. The image of this giant animal going through a hole that one has to squint to see tells us that this is impossible.

The disciples than lament in despair, "Who can be saved?" While Jesus Christ only said the rich, the Disciples understood something important. Riches are subjective and relative. All of us have thins that we refuse to give up in much the same way the rich young ruler could not give up his riches. So how can we be saved?

It seems so hard to go to Paradise. It feels as though there are so many rules and we are failing constantly. Our Lord and Savior then gives us the answer: With man this is impossible but with God, all things are possible.

If we turn to God, He will give us the power to put down the things that prevent us from going to Paradise. What seems impossible by our own will and strength suddenly becomes possible and, not only that, assured. Whatever we ask in His name in faith will be granted to us. I am not talking about silly wishes like a genie. God isn't going to mystically make us win the lottery. No, but He can help us forgive our brothers and sisters. He can help us find peace. He can help us find true wealth and happiness in Him. Without Him, these are impossible and we will find ourselves unable to forgive, unable to escape anxiety and unable to find contentment or happiness. Without Him, like the rich man, we will seek happiness in "items" and never truly be happy.

Hymns of the Church

Part 2: *Sticheron for the Veneration of the Cross*

Celebrated on 14 September, the Exaltation of the Precious and Holy Cross was one of the greatest solemnities of the yearly cycle of worship at the Constantinopolitan Great Church of Hagia Sophia. The background to this feast is summarized in the brief notice for the day contained in the modern Orthodox *Horologion*:

The blessed Helen, mother of Constantine the Great, looked for the Cross in Jerusalem and found it buried in the earth about the year 325. Then the people, seeing it elevated on the ambo by the then patriarch of Jerusalem Makarios, cried out, "Lord, have mercy!" Note that after it finding part of the precious Cross was taken to Constantinople as a blessing, while the rest was left in Jerusalem. There it remained until the year 614, when the Persians, ravaging Palestine, took it back to their own country (January 22). But later, in the year 628, Herakleios led an army against them, took the precious Cross back again and brought it to Constantinople. (Translated by Archimandrite Ephrem Lash)

Commensurate with the profound significance of Christ's redemptive act—His Suffering, Crucifixion, and Resurrection—the Holy Church saturates this great feast with some of the most powerful and beautifully cathartic texts. One such text—*Come believers*—is sung at Mattins after the Great Doxology during the veneration of the Cross:


Come believers, let us worship the life-giving Cross, on which Christ the King of glory, willingly stretching out his hands, raised us up to our ancient blessedness, whom the enemy of old had defrauded through pleasure and made exiles from God.

Come believers, let us worship the Wood, through which we were found worthy to crush the heads of invisible foes.

Come all the families of the nations, let us honour in hymns the Cross of the Lord. Hail, O Cross, the complete redemption of the fallen Adam. In you our faithful Kings boast, as by your power they mightily subdue the people of Ishmael. We Christians now greet you with fear, and glorify the God who was nailed to you, as we say: "Lord, who was nailed to it, have mercy on us, as you are good and love humankind."

The author of this hymn is Emperor Leo VI (the "Wise") reigned from 886–912. The words alternate between the themes of salvation through the Passion and Resurrection of Christ on the one hand, and the wars of Byzantium with the Arabs ("the people of Ishmael") on the other, before closing with a collective plea for divine mercy. We see here a mix of two hymn types—the doxological and contemplative—calling the faithful to worship the Cross and also to contemplate Christ's redemptive acts.




