

Dr. Livingston is a Harvard social psychologist and leading expert on the science of underlying bias and racism in organizations. He will discuss his book, *The Conversation: How Seeking and Speaking the Truth About Racism Can Radically Transform Individuals and Organizations*.



In the wake of the social unrest of 2020 and growing calls for racial justice, many business leaders and ordinary citizens were asking a simple question: How can I become part of the solution?

In *The Conversation*, Dr. Livingston provides a science-based road map to answer this question and help uproot entrenched biases along with candid, fact-based perspectives on race that will lead to increased awareness, empathy, and action.
