



MASK OPTIONAL POLICY TO BEGIN ON SUNDAY, OCTOBER 2

The following is from the letter that went out from the Regathering Committee on a move to Mask Optional during Worship.

We write to let you know that we are changing our masking policy regarding worship on Sundays at the 8:00 AM and 10:00 AM services. Starting on Sunday, October 2, we will move to a “Mask Optional” status for worship gatherings. Thank you to all who graciously and helpfully followed the masking guidelines over the last 2 plus years. Your concern for each other and support of each other is an embodiment of Christ’s call to us to care for one another and a hallmark of St Francis.

With vaccinations and boosters available, as well as treatments, we feel, like most other religious organizations, that a mask optional practice for worship makes sense at this time. . . While masks will be optional, we continue to encourage people to practice safe distancing when indoors. We also trust that as a part of life at St Francis, people will respect the decisions of others regarding masking or not. As weather permits, we will continue to leave the doors open for ventilation in the church and the windows open in the Historic Church.

As we have been doing throughout the pandemic, we will continue to analyze how this new practice works, and we will make changes if necessary. We also will be looking at what the landscape is like as we approach the holiday season. As always, we will communicate any changes or adjustments to the St. Francis community in a timely manner.




ALTAR GUILD BREAKFAST SATURDAY, OCTOBER 8 9:00 AM
