Listening to Your Life . . .

On a recent Friday, I attended the Shabbat service at Temple Sinai. The timing worked, and I felt a need to support a good friend and colleague, Rabbi Jay TelRav, and his congregation. He did not know that I was coming, and, initially, he thought that I knew the young person who was doing her Bat Mitzvah and was there for her rite of passage. I noted that I thought I should be present at services to let the Jewish community know that there are those in the Christian world who recognize their struggle and sense of isolation in this time. Jay was his hospitable self and invited me to offer a prayer in the service. Nothing earth shattering. No major breakthroughs. Just a simple service on a random Friday. (By the way, the Friday service at Temple Sinai is worth a visit. Rabbi TelRav has developed a lovely liturgy and contemplative space for refuge in the hustle and bustle of life.)

Following up a few days later, Jay emailed me about another issue. As an aside, he noted that a long-time parishioner mentioned to him after the Shabbat service that he had never seen a priest in the synagogues he attended throughout his 70+ years of life. It was, for him, deeply moving.

Ours is an incarnational tradition. Showing up matters. Being present matters. As St. Francis famously declared, "Preach the Gospel at all times. If necessary, use words." Indeed, I was struck by how limited our words were at that Shabbat service. The grief, the powerlessness, the uncertainty, and the fear of so many gathered was palpable. (As I write, the ADL has noted a 400% rise in antisemitic acts in the U.S. over the past month and a half.). There were no words to resolve the tension. No smart way to encapsulate feelings. No incantation to drive away the darkness. In that moment, being present was about as good as it could get.

As we enter the new Church year and the season of Advent, showing up and being present are wonderful aspects of life to reflect upon. The Advent season can be a blur with preparations for Christmas, planning for travel or time together, and parties and other events of the season. Showing up there can be exhausting. Yet, during this season, we are invited to consider how we are present and can show up for others and the whole of creation as we wait and anticipate the Advent of the Holy in our midst. We are not so much remembering 2000 years ago to a young child born in Bethlehem. Rather, we await with hope and deep longing the fullness of God to reside in our midst, to heal the fissures that divide our culture and world, to mend the wounds that we carry with us in life, and to restore us all to the blessed place of peace and unity with God, neighbor, and world. It is true for us as well that showing up and

being present matters. The beauty of this season is the reminder that God understands this truth and God does just that. Shows up. Is present. Words cannot fully express the complexity of life, but presence reminds us that we are not alone.
