TRINITY SUNDAY WORSHIP WITH GREATER FAITH BAPTIST CHURCH


On Sunday, June 4, we will try an experiment to expand our understanding of worship and our connection to the family of God in Christ. We will hold the regular 8:00 AM service at the Historic Church on June 4. Then, we invite everyone to join at 11:00 AM with the community of Greater Faith Baptist Church (27 Baxter Avenue) at their location for a joint worship service, drawing on the richness and history of the Baptist tradition. We WILL NOT hold the 10:00 AM service at St. Francis. Pastor Mark will preach, and Grater Faith's minister, Johnny Bush, will preside over the service. We hope that this might move us beyond experiencing Sunday morning as the most segregated time in the week in the United States. We also hope that we might begin to develop relationships with members of Greater Faith Baptist that would enrich both our communities. We do this, in part, because of our commitment to expand our understanding of church and work toward ending systemic racism as a Stamford Stands Against Racism signee. Rev. Bush is a Chaplain at Westchester Medical. He speaks about Chaplaincy below:

St. Francis Hike at Mianus River State Park Scenic Reserve Saturday, April 29th @ 10 AM

Join us for our first hike of the season at the Mianus River State Park Scenic Reserve on Farms Road in Stamford.

The three-mile hike on soft, predominantly flat horse trails winds through a bucolic landscape of farms, forests and water. The hike is suitable for all ages and abilities.









Directions to Mianus River State Park Scenic Reserve:

The trail is about 3 miles from the Main Church. Take Long Ridge Rd. to Riverbank Rd. to Farms Rd. Park on Pony Trail Rd., which is a cul-de-sac on the right hand side. Walk on Farms Rd. for 2/10 mi. over the bridge and look for the group.








Sanctuary Rearrangement Sunday, May 7, at 11:00 AM





SEEKING TO START A GROUP FOR SUMMER OF 2023

Sacred Ground is a film- and readings-based dialogue series on race, grounded in faith. Small groups are invited to walk through chapters of America's history of race and racism, while weaving in threads of family story, economic class, and political and regional identity.

The 11-part series is built around a powerful online curriculum of documentary films and readings that focus on Indigenous, Black, Latino, and Asian/Pacific American histories as they intersect with European American histories.

Sacred Ground is part of Becoming Beloved Community, The Episcopal Church's long-term commitment to racial healing, reconciliation, and justice in our personal lives, our ministries, and our society. This series is open to all, and especially designed to help white people talk with other white people. Participants are invited to peel away the layers that have contributed to the challenges and divides of the present day – all while grounded in our call to faith, hope and love.

As a part of our commitment as a church to seek to understand and end systemic racism, we will be offering another series of *Sacred Ground* conversations this summer. *Sacred Ground* is the excellently curated program of the Episcopal Church that introduces participants to a wide breadth of resources that help us to understand the origins, realities, consequences, and ongoing implications of racism, white supremacy, and anti-black bias. It was a powerful experience for those who participated in the program in 2021. Please let Pastor Lingle know if you are interested in participating. While there is a time commitment to this program, it is well worth it and crucial to a deeper and more nuanced understanding of racism.






