VOLUNTEER ORIENTATION AT BUILDING ONE COMMUNITY SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 14, AT 2:30 PM

The 10 congregations and synagogues that comprise the Interfaith Social Ministry Collaborative have as one of their goals to encourage parishioners to become more deeply involved in relationships and ministry. To that end, we are partnering with Building One Community to offer an orientation to parishioners, so that they might become more involved in tutoring, mentoring, or providing other support using Building One Communities programs.

The orientation will take place at Building One Community (75 Selleck Street in Stamford) on **Sunday, November 14, at 2:30 PM**. Please reply to Pastor Mark if you are interested in attending the orientation, so that we can let BiC prepare for the program. Please attend even if you do not know for sure if you want to volunteer or are unsure of where you might plug in. The information you will receive will be very helpful.

Many thanks for considering this and supporting those in need in our community.

Translator for Family Services Program – must be at least 18 years of age and fluent in Spanish

- Assist in translating legal documents such as birth certificates, medical records, etc.
- Must be computer savvy and proficient in MS Word.
- Time commitment is approximately one month for an average of 4 hours a week.
- Remote opportunity.

Unpaid Wages Volunteer - must be at least 18 years of age and fluent in Spanish

- Ideal for somebody that would like to practice their Spanish skills.
- Assist a participant during a legal consultation regarding unpaid wages.
- Must speak Spanish fluently and be computer literate.
- Thursdays 4:45-6pm. Three month volunteer commitment is ideal but flexible.

Youth Group - must be at least 14 years of age.

- This opportunity is for high school students only. We emphasize responsibility, independence, communication and leadership skills.
- Tutor an adult immigrant English via Zoom for 45 minute one on one sessions.
- We'll provide support from our Youth Group Leaders and some resource materials but you must have the ability to tutor & plan sessions independently.
- We have 2 sessions on Saturday mornings:
 - Onsite at BiC 9:30-11am OR via virtual session via Zoom 11:30am –12:30pm



The Center for Immigrant Opportunity

English Language Learning (ELL) Tutor - must be at least 14 years of age, preferably 16+

This opportunity entails preparing and English tutoring session, setting up a Zoom invite & sending the invite to an adult immigrant and preparing materials for the session.

- Tutor an adult immigrant English via Zoom for 45 minute one on one sessions.
- Must be tech-savvy.
- We'll provide some resource materials, but you must have the ability to tutor & plan sessions independently.
- Schedule flexible depending on volunteer and learner availability.

Technology Literacy Tutor - must be at least 16 years of age

- The technology literacy tutor will be working remotely with B1C participants to practice basic computer skills and teach them to trouble shoot common cloud and internet issues.
- Must have experience using Zoom meetings + online platforms + Microsoft Office.
- Day and Time flexible depending on the tutor and student availability
- Materials: B1C will provide some materials, but the instructor is expected to research for resources
- One on one sessions
- Time commitment: 45 minutes a week tutoring + prep time. Minimum 3-month commitment

Haitian Creole or Arabic Language Interpreters – must be at least 18 years of age

- Assist interpreting in French or Arabic in our Immigration Legal Services Program. This is a remote opportunity and hours/days are TBD.

Job Search Clinic Mentor - must be at least 21 years of age

- The job search clinic mentor will be working remotely with participants that are searching for a job and will help the participant build their resume to the whole process of finding a job
- Must be familiar with: resume and cover letter creation, job search engine use, interviews preparation and follow up
- Must have experience using Zoom and webinar features + online platforms + Microsoft Office.
- Day and time flexible depending on the tutor and student availability
- English/Spanish fluency a plus. Time commitment: 1.5 hour a week + prep time for 3 months.
- B1C will provide some materials, but the instructor is expected to research for resources

Mentor Small Business Owners - must be 21 years of age

- The small business mentor will be working remotely with participants that are looking to create or improve their small business.
- Must be familiar with: small business and have some specialty on either marketing, finances, HR, etc.
- Mentoring experience level: Intermediate
- English/Spanish fluency a plus
- Must have experience using Zoom and webinar features + online platforms + Microsoft Office.
- Time commitment: 1 hour a week + prep time. 6-9 month program
- Schedule: To be determined by mentor and mentee
- B1C will provide access to FDIC training.


