From our Rector

I've been noticing more this month how the work we've done over the years has blossomed into "connected mission." Our people and assets are increasingly making differences in God's work. One reflection that is always popular in church assessments is, "If your church ended tomorrow, would it be missed? Would anyone other than your members care?" It is a sobering point to ponder. But without a doubt today, I would be able to answer that with a resounding "YES! We would be missed. We are making a difference."

It's not just the 90 children we have in the Day School. It's the over 20 outside community groups who meet here, most of them weekly. They include 12-Step groups, yoga, neighborhood civic associations, beading, knitting and sampler groups. We host NATO spouses who dance... a grief group learning to live again after significant losses... cub scouts, brownies, girl scouts and boy scouts! We provide space for two different Jewish congregations for their worship on high holy days.

This month people from three or four churches attended our excellent Wednesday night program by Dr. Finn from Christopher Newport University on the generational impact of redlining neighborhoods in Norfolk. Two other VB parishes are joining us to make youth pilgrimage a reality this year. Tonight at 6:30 we host Dos Santos Food ministry with a concert, and our team will make it a great evening. Last week we hosted over 100 members of the British community for a service of reflection on the life of Queen Elizabeth II with a reception following. Our members are working with the "Urban Renewal Council" for dance and art programs for underserved children at the Williams Farm Rec Center, and driving our bus to bring homeless folks to concerts in Norfolk in October. We are talking with Morning Star Baptist Church about how to be better friends and partners in ministry.

Would anyone miss us if we disappeared? We are connected to our community. The almost dizzying activity above provides the answer. And there is plenty for you to join!

October always features the beginning of our information and encouragement for making financial pledges at All Saints' Sunday for the upcoming year. THANKSGIVING for what God is doing is always the first reason to give generously. Look around. Read above. Give thanks. Do what you can to keep the ball rolling!

Oyster Roast - 87th Annual

From 1934 until 2019, Oyster Roast was always the Saturday before Thanksgiving Day. We've had a two year forced sabbatical, but this year we resume with the 87th

celebration and fund raiser. All the funds raised support our Outreach efforts, which is reason enough. BUT the best part of Oyster Roast is working alongside and getting to know other members of this great parish.

We will have oysters, BBQ, Brunswick Stew, "White Elephant" yard sale, bake sale, Santa pictures, kids games, a dining room and live music. It is a short but very busy day, and you will find there is some role for everyone. Late in October we will put out sign-up lists for where you want to help.

Worship needs YOU

With our return to two services at 10am, real bread in the Gathering, choir and Gathering band separated, we have opportunities for more of you to be involved in active roles. We need greeters/ushers, singers for both the choir and Gathering Band, chalice bearers, readers and acolytes. Every job you see can use more folks. One more pressing need is for "Stream Team" members. We need a few more who will be trained to do our sound board and camera recording so we can assure the very best quality for what we have live in worship as well as what goes out to the world on the internet. Youth and Pilgrimage



From our Associate Rector

For me, the change of weather from summer to fall always brings a sense of comfort along with it. There's something about a cool morning that refreshes my soul. Perhaps it is a reminder that today is a new day. The unbroken heat of summer gives way to something new.

Our program year at church gives something of the same feeling. In the midst of the church's green season, Ordinary Time, which stretches from Pentecost to Advent, we have a switch as our school year starts and we dive into fall programming. We see people who have been on vacation. We return to familiar rhythms, spending more time together in fellowship, study, and prayer. It is a small breath of renewal when we have gotten used to the regular, and sometimes plodding, movement of Ordinary Time.

It also means that we need more people behind the scenes making sure everything runs smoothly. With more activities, there are more things for each of us to do. Our gospel passages from Luke have been leading us through proper use of our money recently, which is important as we turn our focus towards stewardship at the end of October, but another part of our stewardship is offering our time and talent for the building up of our church body.

There are many ways that we can make a difference in our church community. You can sign up to be an usher, a position we've been struggling to fill recently. Ushers not only hand out bulletins and greet people as they arrive, but they also ensure the service runs smoothly by presenting the congregations' gifts at the Offertory and directing traffic for communion. These are small, but necessary things that help us to worship.

We also run Children's Chapel weekly for our children preschool - Grade 5. They are split into older and younger classes, so if your children have not yet attended, we encourage them to give it a try. We have a wonderful curriculum team who prepares lessons and activities, and we need additional adult volunteers either to be the second person present assisting, or to take the prepared lessons and teach. Many of our parents are involved in this ministry, but it is good to have other adults involved as well. Our children need to see how adults put their faith into practice.

Neither of these take very much time, and the more people who volunteer to care for the congregation in this way, the less time it takes any one of us to serve. Besides ushering and Children's Chapel, you could sign up to be a reader, a Eucharistic minister who helps with commun-

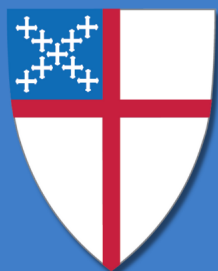
Adult Formation

Stewardship: More Than Enough



We remain in awe of what this parish has been able to accomplish this year, thanks to generous gifts of Time Talent and Treasure by our members. Your Stew-

ardship commission has been developing a "Narrative Budget" in concert with Clergy, Staff, and Commissions that will more easily describe the impact that we have made in the last year, for each other and our larger community in God's name. It will arrive to you soon.

As always, October marks the beginning of our annual campaign. Our theme for this year is "More than Enough," using the imagery of fishes and loaves to remind us that, even coming off of some very challenging years, when we take a full spiritual inventory and our capacity to give, we realize that there is now, and always has been more than enough. To live up to that theme, we have planned an annual campaign kick-off event for October 23rd, that will include food and fellowship, following our Sunday service. Please save this date for now, with more details and registration to follow.

Finally, you will soon receive a mailing from Father Bob with a pledge card for the upcoming year. Since Old Donation budgets are based on the projections from pledges, we kindly request that you return your pledge cards by Ingathering Sunday, observed on November 6th. As always, we thank you for your continued support and generosity in carrying out God's work.

Q & A about Stewardship at ODEC

What is a pledge?

- A financial & spiritual commitment

Why should I make a pledge?

- Thanks to God for blessings and belief in ODEC's mission

Why is giving good for me?

- A spiritual practice. Giving helps us experience joy. Generous giving teaches us that God always provides enough. Connects as members: we know our gifts count & we belong.

Why is a pledge good for ODEC?

- So ODEC can make a budget for ministries & personnel. ODEC never approves a budget without pledges to support it.

How much should I pledge?

- This is personal. The biblical model is proportional giving. The standard is 10% of gross. Pray, listen to God, and step forward.

How much do others pledge?

- Everyone gives based on what they can. Some give \$1.00/wk, others \$25,000+/year.
- Our average pledge last year was \$3,100/yr. Fr. Bob's pledge was over \$10,000 (1/10th of his income) and same for the capital gift.

What if I can't give anything? What if I can only give a little?

- Every gift is worthy. \$1/month is faithful if that's what you can do. We hope everyone will enter a faithful pledge.

How do I pay my pledge?

- Any way you like!

Heads-up! Pledge Cards are coming!

Around the middle of the month, you will receive a red or blue envelope in the mail. The envelope contains information on this year's Stewardship Campaign of "More than Enough" and your annual pledge card.

Prayerfully consider what portion of Christ's gift you will pledge for his work here at Old Donation for 2023. If you consistently make a pledge, thank you. If you have not done so in the past, please make a 2023 commitment. Your pledge, regardless of amount, is an important part of our mission plans for next year. Making a pledge really matters.

Sunday, 6 November is All Saints' Sunday, and our designated "Ingathering" Sunday for everyone to return their pledge cards. However, your pledge is welcome and appreciated at any time.
