You Are Invited to Read the Entire New Testament in 2022!

Have you ever wanted to read the whole Bible, from beginning to end? Perhaps after further thought, the task seemed a bit too daunting, so you decided to just read either the Old or the New Testament. But after a couple of weeks, you veered off the path of discipline, found months had gone by and you were still stuck in Exodus or Mark? Well, do we have an opportunity for you!

The PoP Wednesday Men's Bible Study is planning to read the entire New Testament throughout the upcoming year. Each week they will read and discuss 5 chapters of the New Testament. Beginning with their first meeting on January 5th, and reading 5 chapters a week for 52 weeks, the 260 chapters of the New Testament will be read by their last meeting on December 28, 2022!

The Congregation is invited to read the New Testament, too!! The Men's Bible Study also invites the entire congregation to read the New Testament throughout 2022! They've developed a schedule to stay on track and complete the reading of the New Testament in its entirety, as well as questions to ponder after each section of the weekly readings.

To get started, print off the [2022 New Testament Reading Schedule](#) (*see next page*) and place it in your Bible. **There will also be copies outside the main Church Office in the metal rack available for you to pick up.** Then begin your journey through the New Testament by reading 5 chapters each week. Take a look, too, at the suggested questions at the bottom of the schedule for you to ponder and take actions each week that will help you grow in your faith and reach out in love.
