



**CHECK IN 2018**

Check-in begins at 1 pm on Wednesday. Camp staff will greet you in the parking lot and guide you to your site and through the check-in process. Please do not arrive earlier than 1 pm, as the staff needs to prepare for your arrival. If your den is attending together, please coordinate so that you arrive at the same time. Dens will be checked in as a single unit. Please have all paperwork completed before your arrival. Parts A & B of the BSA Annual Health and Medical Record are required for every youth and adult in camp.

### **WHAT IS WEBELOS RESIDENT CAMP?**

Webelos Resident Camp is an opportunity for Webelos Scouts to come to camp and be introduced to the adventure of Boy Scouting. Webelos Scouts are the transition between Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts.

Boys will be organized into patrols, not dens, and each activity session will be guided by a staff member. As boys move around camp in their daily activities, their parent or den leaders will assist them with their camp experiences. Daily activities include BB and archery ranges, fishing, swimming and boating, climbing and a variety of core and electives requirements. The goal is to help train Webelos in the eight methods of the Boy Scout program and begin their transition from Cub Scouts to Boy Scouts.

## **COST OF CAMP**

The cost for Webelos registering for Resident Camp is \$165 per boy. This covers the cost of program, food and a camp patch. Adult fee is \$50; siblings (ages 5 and over) are \$75.

Prices after May 31<sup>st</sup> are \$195 per Webelos, \$60 per adult, \$90 per sibling. Late registration is subject to space available.

## **REFUNDS**

Refund requests must be made in writing to the Mount Baker Council Service Center, 1715 – 100<sup>th</sup> Pl SE, Suite B, Everett, Washington 98208 at least 30 days prior to the start of camp. A service charge of \$25 will be assessed on all refunds.

**No refunds are granted for requests made less than 30 days prior to camp, unless there is a medically documented illness/injury, death in the family, or the family moves out of the area.** To receive consideration for these cases, the refund request form must be submitted before or on the date of arrival at camp. (Request form is located on the council website under Cub Scout Camping.)

## **OPPORTUNITY FUND**

### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

Every boy deserves the opportunity to attend Scout camp. A family's financial situation should never be a reason for a Scout to miss out on this opportunity for growth and adventure. The Opportunity Fund is financed by friends and Scouters who want to ensure Scouts have the chance to go to camp. Opportunity Fund Scholarships are available for Scouts registered in the Mount Baker Council. Contact the Service Centers for more information and an application. Due by May 1<sup>st</sup>.

## **YOUTH TO ADULT RATIO**

Adult association is an important part of the Scouting program and national camp standards require approved adult supervision at camp with your Webelos Scout. We are encouraging Webelos to attend in their dens, which requires a minimum of 2 adults, with a ratio of 1 adult for every 4 youth. If a boy wants to attend, but his den isn't coming, he needs to come with at least one parent.

### **toilet kit with:**

### **PLEASE LEAVE AT HOME:**

**Weapons, fireworks, pets, valuable items, all electronic devices including: radios, CDs, MP3 players, PSPs, tablets, etc.**

***NOTE: Smoking is not allowed in camp. Please see the Camp Director for acceptable locations.***

On Friday evening, the friendly Fire Mountain camp staff will greet you at the Skagit Shelter to put on an outstanding outdoor feed for all Scouts, leaders, and guests. The BBQ is set for 6:30 pm to accommodate for Friday night traffic. Guests must call the Everett Office at (425)338-0380 to make reservations no later than 12:00 pm Tuesday for the Friday Feast. You may leave a message after hours. Payment will be made at the trading post at camp. \$10.00 Adults, \$5.00 Children.



### **PROGRAM FOR WEBELOS**

### **CORE ADVENTURES ---AND---ELECTIVES**

In addition to BB's, archery, climbing and rappelling, there will be classes focused on some requirements for Webelos Core (required) Adventures and Elective Adventures. There will also be chances to work on Arrow of Light Core and Elective Adventures.



### **Advancement Tracking**

As various achievements are worked on at Resident Camp, participants will receive, upon check-out, a list of requirements completed during camp. The camp staff will not be signing off in books; Scouts will need to work with their den leader to transfer completed requirements to their book after camp. Please double check the advancement sheet **prior to departing camp** and clear up any questions with camp staff.

### **SLEEPING ACCOMMODATIONS AT FIRE MOUNTAIN**

Accommodations at Fire Mountain take two forms, but for Webelos Resident Camp, Scouts and adults will be housed primarily in what we call "stents." These are small wooden buildings with four or two plywood bunks. You will need to bring some kind of sleeping pad, sized no larger than 27" wide by 7.5' long. There is a canvas cover for the door and a window in the rear of each stent.

All campsites have running water, an outhouse and a fire pit. Each campsite also has one or more covered shelters with picnic tables.

**Youth Protection guidelines will be followed at camp.** Separate accommodations for adults and Scouts are required. When camping, no youth is permitted to sleep in the tent/stent/Adirondack of an adult other than his or her own parent or guardian.



### **SIBLING PROGRAM**

Brothers and sisters ages 5 and over are welcome to attend Webelos Resident Camp with their brothers, but will not be participating in the program. Instead there will be special activities such as hiking, games, etc. The sibling program will not be a Scouting program and will include NO advancement opportunities for younger Cubs coming to camp. This resident camp program is designed for Webelos.

### **SATURDAY DEPARTURE**

We will be offering a light breakfast featuring the world-famous Fire Mountain maple bacon cinnamon rolls and special closing ceremony on Saturday morning before camp closes and Scouts check out to go home. After the closing ceremony, your troop guide will assist you with checking out and ensuring your camp site is clean.

### **DIRECTIONS TO CAMP**

#### **FROM THE SOUTH:**

Go North on I-5 to exit 221 (SR 534). Exit freeway and head east. Continue until you reach SR9. Turn left on SR9 and continue approximately five miles. Look for milepost 46. Shortly after this milepost you will see Walker Valley Road. Turn right and continue to the end of the road.

#### **FROM THE NORTH:**

Go South on I-5 to exit 227 (College Way). Exit freeway and head east. Continue until you reach SR9. Turn right on SR9 and drive for approximately 3.7 miles. Look for Walker Valley Road on your left. Turn left and continue to the end of the road.
