For all Snohomish County Scouts: The Snohomish County Parks Department and the Klahaya Scouting District are again sponsoring the annual Centennial Trail Cleanup. This is a very useful and visible service opportunity so please put this on your unit calendar.

All Snohomish County Packs, Troops, Crews, Ships and Posts (including their friends and families) are encouraged to help out. Credit for three hours of community service will be available for participants. Cub Pack participants will be eligible for uniform segments. The work will be at various locations along the southern part of the trail. The work needed is envisioned to be among the following: litter removal, edging, weeding, brush cut back, etc.

Snohomish County Parks & Recreation Forms Required: EVERYONE involved – both youth and adult leaders – will need to submit required forms prior to any volunteer service. The 2017 Volunteer Release Form for all minors and adults and the Service Roster are available from Scouting organizers Marc Bardsley or Ethan Brewer (contact below).

Scouts and youths cannot participate without a release form signed by their parent/guardian. All participants must submit a signed release form before starting service. Please bring your completed forms with you.
