During her time with SC | SU, Adriana has led groundbreaking work focused on accelerating collaboration and response to racial inequities and trauma caused by racism and Adverse Childhood Experiences. Adriana has coalesced a team around developing and co-leading this work through healing-centered community engagement, leadership opportunities for historically unrepresented community members, and community-led strategies to build Diversity Equity & Belonging (DEB) capacity across local mental health and social services systems. As Executive Director of Health Action Together (HA Together), Adriana will lead in building a community-led organization focused on tackling both systems-level and grassroots challenges, aligning partners, and implementing multi-stakeholder change strategies. A cornerstone of this work is developing a new Agenda for Action, informed by the findings of the *Portrait of Sonoma County 2021 Update* and co-created with community members of color and other historically marginalized people who experience the greatest disparities. The Agenda for Action will guide the institutional, political, philanthropic, and community-based efforts and resource investments in Sonoma County, as well as the evolving work of Health Action Together.

Saskia Garcia will transition to Sonoma Connect | Sonoma Unidos Interim Director. Saskia has co-created and co-led with Adriana over the past two years and has experience in nonprofit and cross-sector collaboration leadership in Sonoma County and the North Bay. Saskia's experience includes grants and financial management, public health policy systems and environment changes, data analysis

and visualization, program evaluation, and facilitation and action planning.

Saskia and the SC | SU staff look forward to continuing the work of our three Action Teams and understand that this work would not be possible without you, our partners. Together, we celebrate and support Adriana's leadership and look forward to retaining our shared values and commitment to de-siloing cross-sector partners through community-led policy and systems co-creation.
