This is impossible to accomplish if the child is in an environment that teaches evolution, denies the existence of the God of the Bible, and prohibits the child from even bringing a Bible to school. It is greatly hampered when a child is allowed to listen to anti-God music, search the Internet without filters and/or attend movies that can morally damage even adults.

This may be a good time to renew your intention to honor your child (or your children) by being obedient to the Word of God.

Fabulous Learning


