Helping girls in our community

Our club has welcomed several girls to speak at our meetings to inform our members about what they are doing in the community. Two of the girls belonged to a robotics club called "Awkward Silence". They told us about winning a state championship and what it is like being a girl in male dominated area. The cost to attend these competitions may cost girls more because the room sharing is limited. Our club made a donation to help them get to the next competition.



We also heard from a 12 year old girl that has started her own non-profit, The Avery Project, to provide bikes to children at Christmas. Avery Sampson and her dad successfully have given away over 200 bicycles this past December. Avery explained how when she

was 8 years old and entered a Cinderella Girls Pageant. She loved riding her bike and wanted all children to have that same opportunity, so she came up with a plan to collect donations for bikes for children as her platform. Five year later she has given away over 700 bikes since 2020.



Voices For Change; Stop Human Trafficking



Every year, our club dedicates itself to organizing an informative event aimed at enlightening the community about the critical issue of human trafficking. This year, under the chairmanship of our President-Elect Linda "Mo" Turner, the committee embarked on months of meticulous planning to create an unforgettable experience.

To raise awareness in our small community, we designed and distributed 2500 custom hot beverage sleeves to local coffee shops. We encouraged people to snap photos of themselves with the sleeves and share them on our Facebook page, amplifying the conversa-

tion around human trafficking. Inspired by a creative marketing project presented at a previous SNR conference, our club was eager to adopt and bring this impactful initiative to life.

With funding from a Sierra Nevada Region grant, the event featured an extraordinary keynote speaker—Jenna McKay, a survivor, advocate, and author—whose powerful story captivated the largest audience we've ever hosted. With 100+ in attendance, Jenna's moving words brought humanity to the often-unseen reality of human trafficking. The event also included an insightful

presentation by a representative from Olive Crest, who shared invaluable knowledge about the stages of "grooming" that lead individuals into the tragic cycle of trafficking. Our partnership with Bikers Against Bullying added a heartwarming touch, as their members graciously served lunch to attendees.

The day concluded with an exciting raffle, featuring autographed copies of Jenna's book. Jenna's story left such an indelible impact that she has been invited to speak at the Sierra Nevada Region Conference
