



The 2026 Summer DayCamp Theme is... Summer at the CINEMA

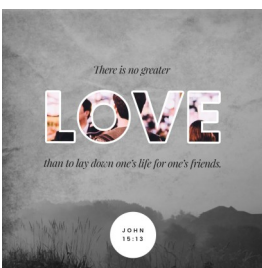
This Summer we will take a look at some BELOVED Movies and find what they can teach us about being Christians in this world.

DAYCAMP GENERAL INFORMATION (This applies to every week)

- * COST is \$40/Day (Scholarships are available if needed). Payment must be made by Monday of each week. There is an added cost (see below) for Extended Care.
- * If you register for part-time we ask that you register for the same days each week that your child plans to attend.
- * TIME is 9:00 am - 2:00 pm Monday-Friday (unless otherwise noted). Extended care will open at 7:00 am (\$5/morning) and close at 5:30 pm (\$10/afternoon)
- * You provide a lunch for your child, Prince of Peace provides a morning and afternoon snack
- * All weeks will be staffed by paid workers under the direction of Katie Rykal, Director of Children and Family Ministry.
- * We will engage in Science, Games, Music, Snack throughout our weeks

June 8-12: Galatians 3:26-28 (ZOOTOPIA 1)

Just as all the animals in Zootopia deserve to be treated with equal respect, so do we as Christians. We are all one in Christ Jesus. The animals in Zootopia will teach us lessons of love, respect, and overcoming diversity. We will be reminded to treat others equally



JUNE 15-19: John 15:13 (JUNGLE BOOK)

A movie about a human—adopted into the animal world—teaches us a lot about sacrificial love. While some animals look to hurt Mowgli, the other animals rally around him to protect him as if he is their own. The love him unconditionally—so much that they let him go.

JUNE 22-26: John 1:5 (TANGLED)

What can the story of a girl locked in a tower teach us about being good Christians? It reminds us of Jesus' unconditional love, and it reminds us to be the shining light for those who may feel isolated in society. We see multiple examples of this unconditional love and shining lights

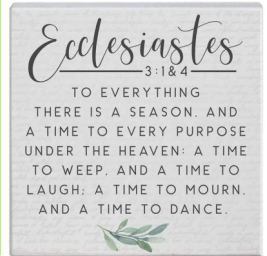


JULY 6-10: Psalm 147:2-4 (HUNCHBACK OF NOTRE DAME)

Hunchback of Notre Dame gives us the story of Quasimodo, a hunchback who gets confined to the inner cellars of the cathedral because of how he looks and because he is an outcast. But then we meet Esmerelda, who is also considered an outcast who speaks out for the marginalized.

JULY 13-17: Ecclesiastes 3:1-11 (INSIDE OUT 1 and 2)

The Inside Out movies help us dive deep into our emotions/feelings and force us to understand that there is a time and place for all emotions. There is a time and place for joy AND sadness, anxiety AND calm. How do we work to allow space for all of them?



JULY 20-24: 1 Corinthians 12:4-6 (KUNG FU PANDA MOVIES)

In the Kung Fu Panda movies we meet Po, an over zealous panda who becomes the Dragon Warrior. Over the course of the movies he often wonders WHY he was chosen, and what good he can bring to the world. In Kung Fu Panda 3, Po meets his family—for the first time ever, and his “chi” all makes sense.

JULY 27-31: Romans 12:1-2 (UGLY DOLLS)

In a world that teaches us we need to look a certain way, act a certain way, or have a certain amount of “popularity” a group of Ugly Dolls teaches us that living a life always trying to please others isn’t going to get us anywhere? What happens if we fight against perfection and live lives that make us happy?



AUGUST 3-7: 1 Corinthians 12 (LILO AND STITCH)

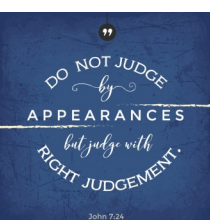
“Ohana means family and family means no one is left behind or forgotten.” We will spend our week diving into what it means to be a part of a family where all belong, all are loved, all are supported and no one is left behind. Family means love and sacrifice. We are all equal parts of Gods family

AUGUST 10-14: 1 Corinthians 13 (WILD ROBOT)

We meet ROZ, a robot who is trying to find her purpose. Roz’s journey mirrors Christlike love, highlighting themes of selfless sacrifice, radical hospitality, and creating community, as she lays down her “life” for the animals and transforms their violent, instinct-driven world.
