

Who we are

The first and only nationwide addiction treatment program leveraging contingency management



- Our integrated recovery program works from a **smartphone app**
- **Counseling and doctor appointments** are conducted over secure video conference via the app, so they are accessible anywhere
- **Financial incentives** drive motivation and offer tangible support for life necessities
- Medical providers **manage overall health**, prescribe supportive meds
- Our support team helps raise social determinants of health: **employment, housing, medical help, lower bills**, and more.

Innovative treatment in a familiar business model



Provider Contracting

- We contract as a healthcare provider, not a vendor
- Unlike almost all digital care programs, we are licensed in each state as a facility



Universal Coverage

- We serve both commercial and Medicaid populations
- We offer multiple SUD treatment services
- Unlike other digital programs, we handle higher complexity, more severe disorders



Digital, Evidence-Based Intervention

- Unlike traditional outpatient treatment programs, we are both accessible and affordable
- Member retention is driven by incentives, not MAT, which has shown uneven results and high recidivism rates

6-month intensive + an open-ended maintenance



Daily remote engagement, education, and rewards

Smartphone app and SMS engagement for care navigation, new habit formation, rewards redemption, and progress tracking

- 3-5 behavioral therapy tasks
- Appointment reminders
- Incentive payments



Weekly addiction counseling and drug/alcohol screening

Telemedicine counseling for identity re-creation, sobriety skill building, goal setting and accountability



- Twice-weekly group counseling
- Scheduled substance screenings
- Once-weekly individual counseling



Whole-person health management

Cravings and withdrawal management
Co-occurring disorder management



- Monthly medical appointments
- Curated med recommendations
- Health risk assessment



Best Practice: Contingency Management

Dependable, positive reinforcement for desired behaviors

Vouchers, prizes or financial incentives are earned in exchange for submitting methamphetamine-free urine samples or negative breathalyzers

General principles:

Clear incentive schedule

Scheduled and random testing

Timely rewards

Keystone of holistic behavioral and medical care

Best Practice: Raising SDoH

Social Determinants of Health are the conditions in which people are born, work and live. SDoH are shaped by the distribution of money, power and resources.

General:


- Economic stability
- Race
- Education
- Gender
- Neighborhood and physical environment
- Food
- Community and social context
- Health care system

Specific to Substance Use Disorders:


- Incarceration, parole and probation
- Mobility (e.g. loss of drivers license)
- Conviction history limiting employment and housing
- Social isolation in early sobriety

Affect Offers Robust Case Management






Retention in Treatment by Quarterly Cohort



N = 230

Our retention in treatment is roughly twice that of traditional outpatient programs for methamphetamine use disorder patients – (noted here as “Treatment as Usual” or TAU), and investments in our clinical systems are driving continued improvements over time.


Increase in Days Sober - Stimulant Use Disorder



Month 0 = Self-reported number of days sober per month prior to treatment

The median increase in days sober/month is 17 days, with the top quartile of members achieving full sobriety. Data is derived from biologic drug screens administered weekly over secure video conference.

Increase in Days Sober - Alcohol Use Disorder



Week 0 = Self-reported number of days sober per week prior to treatment

The median increase in days sober/week is 5 days, with both 50th and 75th percentile members achieving full sobriety within 6 weeks. Data is derived from randomized breathalyzer tests conducted twice daily and collected via our app.

Our digitally-native treatment program is hyper convenient, discreet, and effective. By combining a digital therapeutic app with an integrated care model, our program delivers member retention and abstinence rates substantially higher than traditional treatment programs.

Rewards and Incentives With Game Design Theory



Contingency Management (cash incentives for program adherence) creates compulsion loops that stimulate the brain's reward system to replace drug dependency and reinforce healthy behaviors.

A Holistic Curriculum and Skills to Recover and Rebuild



The Matrix Model provides the foundation for a methodology that goes beyond traditional recovery programs to address SUDH skills like employment and secure housing.

Clinical Care and Recovery Community at the Fingertips



Members attend group and individual therapy and complete drug screens, all from the app. It tracks health data, manages appointments, and gives reminders to help patients stay on their recovery journey.

How to refer a patient:

Patients must be over 18 and have a previous or current history of stimulant use (including meth, cocaine, and prescription stimulants).

What happens once I make a referral?

- The care specialist will obtain basic information – and will need to speak directly to the member. The call will take roughly 10 minutes.
- The member will be provided with basic information explaining how to access the intake appointment, how to download our patient app, and how to reach us. At the end of the call, the care specialist will then make the appointment.
- At the conclusion of the call, the care specialist will schedule the 10 minute counselor intake appointment. Ideally within 72 hours of the call being placed.
- After a member is admitted, our care team will collaborate with the referring partner and other providers as appropriate to share care plans and manage the overall health of the member.
