

Block grants overview

What is a block grant?

- Noncompetitive formula grant mandated by the U.S. Congress
- Must submit an annual application

SAMHSA is responsible for two block grant programs

- Community Mental Health Services Block Grant (MHBG)
- Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant (SABG)



Mental Health Block Grant

MHBG overview

What is the purpose of the MHBG?

- Provides funds and technical assistance
- Funds are used to plan, implement, and evaluate activities that support and treat
 - Adults with serious mental illnesses
 - Children with serious emotional disturbances
 - Persons experiencing First Episode Psychosis

Substance Abuse Block Grant

SABG overview

What is the purpose of the SABG?

- Provides funds and technical assistance
- Funds to plan, implement, and evaluate activities that prevent and treat substance use and promote public health in Arizona
- Available to provide substance use treatment services for those with a substance use disorder
- For adults and youth that are uninsured or underinsured

- Pregnant women/teenagers who use drugs by injection
- Pregnant women/teenagers who use substances
- Other persons who use drugs by injection

⁴ Screening/assessments may be covered for Non-Title XIX/XXI eligible members when the screening is a primary screening, and/or the screenings are being considered for admission to mental health facilities to determine the appropriateness of such admission. A secondary provider assessment and screening to decide determinations is unallowable.

⁵ Non-Title XIX funded members determined to have an SMI or SED who are in need of Substance Use Disorder (SUD) services could be eligible for this SUD service under SABG.

⁶ This service is only available for adolescents up until the age of 18 who have an identified Substance Use Disorder.

⁷ These services are only available through Non-Title XIX/XXI funding.
