Trinity Presbyterian Church's Shelter program has the mission to provide a welcoming and safe environment to those who are legally seeking asylum. The Shelter at Trinity has been open for 6 months. Our first orientation was done January 6th by Catholic Community Services for the Casa Alitas shelters of which we are one. We are referred to as the 'sweet shelter'.

Come and see what we do and how you can help. Learn what it's like to volunteer and have an invaluable part in the effort to provide a safe and dignified transition for asylum seeking migrants. There are many ways you can help without directly volunteering, too.

On June 8th, 10am-12pm at Trinity in Room 23, we will be explaining Trinity's guidelines for a safe environment; reviewing our Volunteer Manual; talking about our needs; about what we do when we don't speak Spanish; how the shifts work; and what we do to make our guests happy and feel safe.
