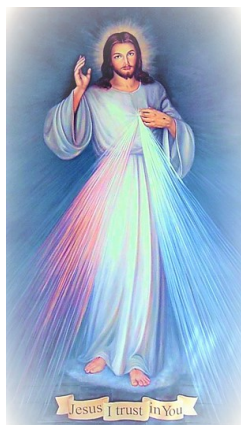


DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY ~ SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER



I. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament

Hymn: O Salutaris Hostia

O salutaris Hostia	Uni trinoque Domino
Quæ cæli pandis ostium.	Sit sempiterna gloria:
Bella premunt hostilia;	Qui vitam sine termino,
Da robur, fer auxilium.	Nobis donet in patria. Amen.

(Opening Prayer)

II. Liturgy of the Word—Romans 5:6-11

Leader: The Word of the Lord

All: Thanks be to God

III. The Three O'Clock Prayer

Leader: Let us put ourselves in the presence of the Lord as we pray together the three o'clock prayer:

All: You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty yourself out upon us.

Leader: O Blood and Water which gushed forth from the heart of Jesus as a Fountain of Mercy for us

All: I trust in You!

*Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One,
have mercy on us and the whole world! (3x)
Jesus, King of Mercy, we trust in You!*

IV. The Divine Mercy Chaplet

Begin with the Sign of the Cross, Our Father, Hail Mary, and Apostles Creed

For each "Our Father" bead of the Rosary:

Leader: Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ.

All: In atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

For each "Hail Mary" bead:

Leader: For the sake of His sorrowful Passion,

All: Have mercy on us and on the whole world.

After the five decades (3x):

Leader: Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One,

All: Have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Leader: Let us pray: Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself. Amen.

V. Litany in Praise of the Divine Mercy

Our response for each is "I trust in You."

Solemn Act of Entrustment of the World to the Divine Mercy

All: O God, merciful Father, in Your Son Jesus Christ, You have revealed Your love and poured it out upon us in the Holy Spirit, the Comforter. We entrust to You today the destiny of the world and of every man and woman.

Bend down to us sinners, heal our weaknesses, conquer all evil, and grant that all the inhabitants of the earth may experience Your mercy. May they always find the source of hope In You, the Triune God.

Eternal Father, for the sake of the sorrowful Passion, and the Resurrection of Your Son, have mercy on us and on the whole world. Amen.

In Thanksgiving

All: O Jesus, Eternal God, I thank You for Your countless graces and blessings. Let every beat of my heart be a new hymn of thanksgiving to You, O God! Let every drop of my blood circulate for You, Lord. My soul is one hymn in adoration of Your Mercy. I love you God, for Yourself alone. Amen (Diary #1794)

To the Mother of God

Leader: O Mary, my Mother and my Lady, I offer you my soul, my body, my life and my death, and all that will follow it. I place everything in your hands. O my Mother, cover my soul with your virginal mantle and grant me the grace of purity of heart, soul and body. Defend me with your power against all enemies, and especially against those who hide their malice behind the mask of virtue. Fortify my soul that pain will not break it. Mother of grace, teach me to live by God's power.

O Mary ... a terrible sword has pierced your holy soul. Except for God, no one knows of your suffering. Your soul does not break; it is brave, because it is with Jesus. Sweet Mother, unite my soul to Jesus, because it is only then that I will be able to endure all trials and tribulations, and only in union with Jesus will my little sacrifices be pleasing to God. Sweetest Mother, continue to teach me about the interior life. May the sword of suffering never break me. O pure Virgin, pour courage into my heart and guard it . Amen!

Leader: Our Lady of Mercy,

All: Pray for us!

Prayer of the Intercession of St. Faustina

Leader: St. Faustina, you told us that your mission would continue after your death and that you would not forget us. Our Lord also granted you a great privilege, telling you to "distribute graces as you will, to whom you will, and when you will." Relying on this, I ask your intercession for the graces I need, especially...*(silently mention your petition)*. Help me, above all, to trust in Jesus as you did and thus to glorify His mercy every moment of my life. Amen.

Leader: St. Faustina,

All: Pray for us!

Prayer for Healing

Leader: Jesus, may Your pure and healthy blood circulate in my poor ailing organism, and may Your pure and healthy body transform my weak unhealthy body, and may a healthy and vigorous life flow once again within me, if it is truly Your Holy Will. Amen!

Leader: O Blood and Water which gushed forth from the heart of Jesus as a Fountain of Mercy for us,

All: I trust in You!

Prayer for Souls

Our Lord said that the following prayer would release 1,000 souls from Purgatory each time it is said. The prayer was extended to the living sinners as well.

All: Eternal Father, I offer Thee the Most Precious Blood of Thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the masses said throughout the world today, for all the holy souls in purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal church, those in my own home and within my family. Amen.

Leader: Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord

All: And let perpetual light shine upon them!

Leader: May their souls, and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the Mercy of God, rest in peace!

All: Amen!

Prayer for Divine Mercy

O greatly Merciful God, Infinite Goodness, today all mankind calls out from the abyss of its misery to Your mercy — to Your compassion, O God; and it is with its mighty voice of misery that it cries out. Gracious God do not reject the prayer of this earth's exiles! O Lord, Goodness beyond our understanding, Who are acquainted with our misery through and through, and know that by our own power we cannot ascend to You, we implore You; anticipate us with Your Grace and keep on increasing Your mercy in us, that we may faithfully do Your holy will all through our life and at death's hour.

Let the omnipotence of Your mercy shield us from the darts of our salvation's enemies, that we may with confidence, as Your children await Your final coming—that day known to You alone. And we expect to obtain everything promised us by Jesus in spite of all our wretchedness. For Jesus is our Hope: Through His merciful Heart as through an open gate we pass through to heaven.

Benediction

Hymn: Tantum Ergo

Leader: You have given the Bread from Heaven, Alleluia.

All: Having all sweetness within it, Alleluia

Leader: Let us pray. Lord Jesus Christ, you gave us the Eucharist as the memorial of your suffering and death. May our worship of this sacrament of your body and blood help us to experience the salvation you won for us and the peace of the kingdom where you live with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

All: Amen. *(please remain silent during Benediction until the priest returns to kneeler)*

Blessed be the Name of Jesus
Blessed be His Most Sacred Heart
Blessed be His Most Precious Blood
