SCRIPTURE *Ruth 2:1-16* Maryse Postlewaite

Now Naomi had a relative through her husband, a warrior-hearted man of worth, from the family of Elimelech, and his name was Boaz. And Ruth the Moabite said to Naomi, “Let me go to the field and glean among the ears of grain, behind someone in whose eyes I may find favor.” Naomi said to her, “Go, my daughter.” And she went, and came and gleaned in the field behind the reapers. As it happened, she happened upon the part of the field that belonged to Boaz, who was from Elimelech’s family. Then, suddenly, Boaz came from Bethlehem. He said to the reapers, “God be with you.” They answered, “God bless you.”

Then Boaz said to his boy stationed over the reapers, "To whom does this girl belong?" The boy stationed over the reapers answered, "She is the Moabite, the one who returned with Naomi from the country of Moab. She said, 'Please, let me glean and gather among the sheaves behind the reapers.' So, she came, and she has been standing from the morning until now, only resting in the shelter a little."

Then Boaz said to Ruth, "Have you not heard my daughter? Go not to glean in another field neither leave this one, thus you will cling to my girls. Keep your eyes on the field that is being reaped, and follow after them [the girls]. Have I not commanded the boys not to touch you? When you thirst, go to the vessels and drink from what the boys have drawn." Then she fell on her face and bowed down to the ground, and said to him, "Why have I found favor in your sight, that you would distinguish me, as I am a foreigner?" And Boaz answered and said to her, "It has been told to me, all that you have done for your mother-in-law after the death of your husband, that you have forsaken your mother and father and your native land and came to a people that you did know before yesterday. May the Holy One of Old reward your works, and may you have a full recompense from the Holy One, the God of Israel, under whose wings you have come for refuge." Then Ruth said, "May I continue to find favor in your eyes, my lord, for you have comforted me and have spoken to the heart of your slave woman, and I, I am not one of your slave women."

Boaz said to her when it was time to eat, "Draw near, and eat from this bread, and dip your piece in the vinegar." And she sat beside the reapers, and he handed her some roasted grain; and she ate and was satisfied, and she had some left over. When Ruth got up to glean, Boaz commanded his boys saying, "She may even glean between the sheaves, and do not humiliate her. You must also pull out some for her from the bundles, and leave them for her to glean, and do not rebuke her."
