

# "Cooling God's House Together"

Blessings to you! June 1, 2024

The warmth of summer has begun to embrace us. Summer, with its sunshine and longer days, offers



us numerous opportunities for worship, fellowship, and community engagement. Yet, it also brings a challenge that <u>many of us have felt every summer—our beloved sanctuary becomes too hot</u>, making it difficult for us to fully engage in worship.

The council routinely canceled services during August from the turn of the century until the late 1930s because of the heat. In the summers of

the 1960s the congregation would head downstairs to the air-conditioned basement! Nowadays we shift our worship to the air-conditioned lounge when the temperature in the sanctuary is unbearable. Some worshippers even wear shorts to be comfortable. The summers will continue to get warmer, due to climate change.

After considering the available options, our leadership has decided to embark on a cooling project to enhance our worship experience: the installation of a new air conditioning system in our sanctuary.

This improvement will not only ensure comfort during our services but also create a welcoming environment for summer visitors. It will take some stress off our organ, reducing the tunings, since temperature swings will be lessened. It will also be more comfortable for other summer events, including funerals, weddings or concerts.



#### **Our Vision**

This air conditioning project is more than a simple upgrade. It is a <u>commitment to making our church</u> <u>a more comfortable and inviting</u> place for everyone to pray, to sing, to listen and to receive holy communion.

The system we have selected is to be installed against the west sanctuary wall underneath the arches. This location will cool the areas where worshippers and worship leaders sit. The two units may be partly visible in certain pews. Electrical cabling will be hidden. No stencils will be affected.

We aim to install two ductless split system wall-mounted units, providing 60,000 BTU/hour of silent cooling. The two outdoor compressors will be fixed on the flat sub-roof between the lounge and the church. We have selected the contractor who did a very similar installation at St John-St Matthew-Lutheran Church in Park Slope, which they are happy with.

The total cost for this project, including the purchase, installation, and necessary electrical upgrades, is estimated to be \$20,000. Achieving this goal is possible through the combined efforts and generosity of our congregation and supporters like you.

Do you remember that in 2018 we raised funds for the 4th floor parsonage renovation and a better sound system? In 2019 we beautified the narthex and also the sanctuary nave. In 2020 & 2021 we restored the entire organ for its first time and the entire undercroft (basement) area was remodeled. In 2022 we restored the sanctuary balcony. In 2023 we updated the basement kitchen, the lounge and lounge kitchen, including new flooring and electrical. This summer we aim to install air conditioning.



#### **How You Can Help**

You're invited to make this vision a reality. I'd like to see you in worship as often as possible this summer, in person or online. The summer is a good time to think through longer term decisions, reassess your values and re-ignite your faith. I am planning a summer preaching series. Our Soup Kitchen has expanded into providing groceries for our
