From the Rector



Celebrating Ascension Day 'I am with you always, to the end of the age'

The season of Easter lasts fifty days, stretching from Easter Sunday to Pentecost. At the tail end of Eastertide, there are three principal feasts observed by the church: Ascension Day (Thursday, May 26), Pentecost (June 5), and Trinity Sunday (June 12).

Of the seven principal feasts observed by the church, these three all fall within a few weeks of each other! The Sundays of Pentecost and Trinity are always observed with great fanfare. However, Ascension Day sometimes is overlooked: it always falls on a Thursday, because it is always observed on the fortieth day after Easter.

For centuries, however, the Feast of the Ascension was remembered in a big way by Christians around the world. Anglicans in particular have long celebrated the Ascension, not as Christ's departure from this world, but as his joining of heaven and earth in a new creation. Former Archbishop of Canterbury Rowan Williams writes that, after the Ascension, "the things and the persons of this world are seen in a new way, seen as charged with hope, with a future of glory and of healing... We are caught up in the eternal movement of God's commitment to his creation."

This month, Trinity church will celebrate Ascension Day by walking the Stations of the Resurrection. This short service is analogous to the Stations of the Cross we walked on Good Friday. During the Stations of the Resurrection, we will remember fourteen major happenings reported in the New Testament, stretching from the Earthquake that shook the world after Jesus' crucifixion, all the way to the sending of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

We'll gather for Ascension Day in Trinity's courtyard, on Thursday, May 26 at 6pm. After the service, all are invited to walk over and enjoy the sunset at Banks Food Hall!
