As you know, we have focused on being fiscally responsible as a parish for a number of years which meant trying to keep our operating expenses in line with our operating income excluding endowment funds ("Count Me In"). In 2018, we were able to do just that! While we had planned on needing some savings to balance our budget in 2018, we did not have to use any of those Count Me In funds in 2018! Thank you to all who donated time and funds to help us achieve this milestone.

Coming into February of this year (2019), we faced a \$15,000 budget deficit, since we had increased the budget to provide raises for full-time employees who had not received such an increase in 4 years and would be at full staff with a new associate. However, a number of our fellow parishioners either pledged or increased their pledge to erase the budget deficit. I thank everyone who pledged this year and allowed us to present a balanced budget without having to include a portion from Count Me In funds. Sometimes, a budget can be taken for granted, but I assure you that is not the case at Trinity. We will continue to strive for balance going forward.

Finally, you may notice a few improvements around Trinity, which have resulted from generous gifts. For instance, we have benefited from security officers at Trinity due to such generosity, and the landscaping around our parking lot is also being refreshed thanks to a combination of the generosity of a parishioner and the City of Columbus. I can't thank all of you who give so much to Trinity in the way of monetary gifts and your valuable time. Without you, this place would not be so special.



Rev. Kyle Stillings -

Almighty God, we pray you graciously to behold this your family, for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed, and given into the hands of sinners, and to suffer death upon the cross; who lives and reigns for ever and ever. *Amen. -The Book of Occasional Services 2003, p.26*

The above prayer is a seasonal blessing that is an alternative for use during Holy Week after communion. For me it is a simple summary of our central narrative as Christians. We pray for grace from God not because of our own merits, but because of the work of Jesus Christ upon the cross done on our behalf. During Holy Week we hear again each year about the Passion (from the Latin for "suffering," there is nothing of romance in this story) of our Lord and savior. There is a rapid transition from Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem to his betrayal, mockery of a trial, and execution. These transitions are jarring, and intentionally so; they are meant to shake us awake, and force us to confront our cruelest and most sinfully violent impulses. Many churches read the gospel on Palm Sunday as a play in order to further draw the congregation into participating in the reality of Christ's suffering and death.

We participate in the betrayal and death of God. This ought to break our hearts. It should break our hearts wide open, but that wound of grief and sorrow also opens us up to allow Jesus to enter into our hearts. We remember our participation in sin, but also Jesus Christ's participation in redeeming our lives upon the cross. We prepare ourselves for the wonder and glory of Easter morning when with joy and relief we see that our God is stronger than our weakness and cruelty, stronger than the forces of sin and evil, stronger even than death.
