


Prayer Book Spirituality

Catechesis Class Begins October 15th




What does it mean to be an Episcopalian? Where do the prayers we pray together on Sundays come from, and what are they trying to teach us? This Fall, you are invited to explore these and other questions in a small group class. The class, which will meet for six Sunday evenings beginning October 15th, will study the book *Inwardly Digest* by Derek Olsen, a former member of the standing commission on liturgy and music. Olsen's lucid reflections will help us open up the Book of Common Prayer, and discover in its pages a link to the broad and deep tradition of Anglican Christian belief and practice, and guidance for our own spiritual journey.

This special class will meet on Sundays at Trinity from 4:00-5:30 beginning October 15th. Copies of Inwardly Digest will be available for purchase at a discounted rate. Participants in the class will have an opportunity to be received or confirmed in the Episcopal church when Bishop Wright visits Trinity on January 7th, 2024. Questions?
