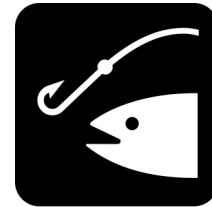

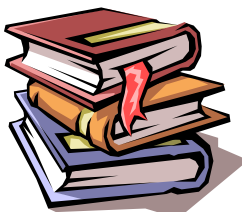

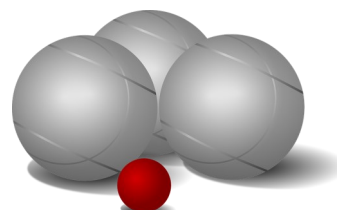

Oakwood Summer Reading Program

Reading and Writing Volunteers Needed

Volunteers encourage the development and love of reading and writing skills by working one-on-one with students in a drop-in type environment for an hour each week. Volunteers will facilitate a 10-15 minute reading and writing check in with students by engaging in discussion about the student's reading and writing from the past week, listening to the students read, and writing with the student. Volunteers can expect to meet with 4 to 5 different students during the hour.

Key Responsibilities:

- Meet with students who have completed grades K-5, one-on-one for 10-15 minutes. Expect to meet with 4-5 different students each week.
- Inspire students to love reading and writing by sharing your passion for reading and writing
- Build trusting relationships

Time Commitment:

One hour per week. Training is provided on site and Wayzata School's staff is always on hand to answer questions and provided support.. Due to the importance of relationship building in this position, volunteers must commit to the 1 hour time slot weekly, June-August. There is a possibility of working around vacations, but this must be communicated in advance in order to adjust volunteers.
