

This week we Celebrated Mass with Bishop Gregory. The mass was on the Feast of Feast of Saint Marguerite Bourgeoys (1620-1700). The first Female Saint of Canada and Patron of the Poor.



For over 350 years, the Congregation of Notre-Dame have car-

ried on Saint Marguerite's legacy of empowering women, children, and the poor through education, thereby creating stronger families and a better society in Canada and beyond. In 1982, Pope John Paul II declared Marguerite Bourgeoys the first female saint of Canada.
