A. Workshop Overview¹

2019 has been a very active year regarding new approaches to managing HIV infection. Current studies estimate a 15 percent incidence of diabetes mellitus in HIV-infected patients in the U.S. compared to 9.5 percent in the general population, and a prevalence of metabolic syndrome ranging from 14-18 percent. Nearly half of HIV-infected have two or more features of metabolic syndrome. These conditions put patients at significant cardiovascular risk. HIV clinical care providers need information on the practical approach to assessing and managing the growing list of metabolic complications in people living with HIV. The 2019 MATEC-WI/AAHIVM Advanced Clinical Workshop will review latest research and studies on metabolic syndrome, lipodystrophy, co-existing conditions, and potential treatment modalities. The workshop is intended to be interactive, and significant time for discussion with the presenters will be provided.

Who Should Attend

This workshop is designed for clinical decision makers, including physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, and pharmacists, who are actively treating or will be treating patients with HIV infection. As space allows, the workshop will also be open to other HIV practitioners including nursing professionals, dentists, mental health providers, and medical case managers.

Dr. Lee serves as the medical director of the Lipid/ Lipodystrophy Clinic located within the Owen's Clinic of the University of California, San Diego's Medical Center, where the collective HIV team cares for over 3,000 people living with HIV. The Lipid/Lipodystrophy Clinic focuses on managing a variety of metabolic complications of antiretroviral therapy such as dyslipidemia, diabetes/insulin resistance, bone disease, wasting, and obesity. Dr. Lee serves as both an HIV and primary care provider for his patients.
