Postdoctoral Research Associate Position in Early Childhood Nutrition and Health

**Lincoln, Nebraska – Full-time, 2-year appointment with a potential
for extension or promotion to a permanent position**

POSITION SUMMARY: Dr. Dipti Dev's Research and Extension Lab at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln is seeking a motivated and skilled Postdoctoral Research Associate to join a dynamic team advancing nutrition and health outcomes for rural children through the newly funded **NIH R01 5-year** grant titled, “Effectiveness of a Multilevel Rural Community Engagement Model for Improving Children’s Dietary Intake in Family Child Care Homes (FCCHs).” This initiative expands the Ecological Approach to Prevention (EAT for Prevention) program to improve health outcomes for Nebraska’s rural children and advance evidence-based solutions in early childhood nutrition policies.

The role offers an exciting opportunity to contribute to innovative research aimed at transforming early childhood nutrition practices.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

This position supports the implementation and evaluation of the *Ecological Approach to Prevention (EAT for Prevention)* program, focusing on:

1. Improving children’s dietary intake and health outcomes.
2. Enhancing feeding practices and emotional mealtime climates in family childcare homes.
3. Identifying mediators driving program effectiveness.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Coordinate NIH-related data collection activities in collaboration with community partners and Extension professionals.
- Conduct and analyze data to prepare reports supporting future grant applications and report dissemination.
- Write additional grants to build on the preliminary data from the NIH grant.
- Write and publish manuscripts in high-impact, peer-reviewed journals.
- Mentor and guide doctoral and master’s students on research and publications.
