- We hope to hire multiple interns for the summer of 2021. Projects include:
 - **The Police Policies Project.** Help us gather and analyze Massachusetts police-department policies on federal immigration enforcement!
 - **Report on Massachusetts Immigration Policies.** Help us produce an advocacy-oriented report on recent Massachusetts efforts to protect immigrants from deportation!
 - **Partnership for Immigrants' Rights.** Support an interdisciplinary group of immigration advocates and Northeastern professors who work collaboratively on promoting immigrants' rights!
- These internships are available to upper-level students who are taking classes during the summer term. Interns generally work 8 hours per week on a flexible schedule. (Additional hours are available but not required.) Compensation is available only for work-study-eligible students.
