

Open Letter to the Jewish Community
Senator Kelly Loeffler (R-GA)

When Governor Kemp appointed me to serve in the U.S. Senate, I promised to bring my experience in the business world to deliver real results for the people of Georgia. And over the past eleven months, I have delivered on that promise.

In Washington, I have worked to spur economic growth and create jobs, deliver targeted relief to Georgia families throughout COVID-19, and ensure school choice for parents across our state. I have done everything in my power to protect innocent life, our Constitutional rights, safety and security, and America's strength on a world stage. And one of my most important priorities from the start has been to stand with our country's strongest ally - Israel.

Over the last year, I have supported our President's decision to move the U.S. Embassy to Jerusalem, supported the Iranian arms embargo, voted to send more defense dollars to Israel, and vocally condemned anti-Semitism in our country – particularly with the Boycott, Divest, and Sanction movement.

But during my time in our nation's capital, I have also seen so-called leaders on the far-Left - like Rashida Talib and Ilhan Omar, who routinely attack the nation of Israel and disparage the Jewish people. Their rhetoric, including calling Israel "evil" and demanding the dissolution of the Jewish state, has no place in America - let alone in Congress.

If elected, my opponent, Raphael Warnock, would add yet another voice to the anti-Israel cadre in Congress - posing a significant threat not only to America's longstanding relationship with Israel, but to Jewish communities across our country.

Warnock is the most radically liberal candidate anywhere in the country, with a shocking history of supporting anti-Semites and spouting anti-Israel rhetoric. He signed a resolution calling for an end to all U.S. military aid to Israel. He has called the nation of Israel an "oppressive regime" reminiscent of an "apartheid state." He has condemned Israel for defending itself, accusing Israelis of "shooting down Palestinians like birds of prey." He has openly supported anti-Israel pastor Jeremiah Wright, and even welcomed the support of CAIR, an anti-Israel hate group.

Inflammatory positions like these are exactly why we've seen an exponential rise in anti-Semitic attacks across this nation over the last few years - and I won't stand for it.

Unlike my opponent, I will always support the nation of Israel and its right to self-determination. I will always be a voice for Georgia's Jewish community and all Americans' right to religious freedom. And I will always oppose radicals like Raphael Warnock whose disdain for Israel imperils the lives and livelihoods of the Jewish faithful across this nation.

Georgians need a common-sense businessperson and conservative outsider in the United States Senate to defend the Constitution – and support our country's strongest ally. On January 5th, or now during early voting, I would be honored to earn your vote.
