Track & Field

WOLVES MOVE UP IN RANKINGS

Several Eastlake track and field athletes ran, threw and jumped their way to top marks in the State 4A rankings and into the Wolves track history books in a dual meet with Lake Washington on Friday, May 21st.

Taking advantage of a perfect spring evening, the girls 4x200m relay, which included Abby Beckstead, Azita Balsara, Peyton Quinto and Ava Hagwell got the meet off to a spectacular start by winning the race in a 1:46.48 clocking. The time currently ranks second in state 4A and is 3rd all time for EHS.

Caden Barrysmith also had a blockbuster meet winning both the 100m and the 200m in personal best times of 11.18 and 22.28 respectively. He is currently ranked 3rd in state 4A in the 200m and 4th all time for Eastlake. He trails only the Lewis brothers (Troy, Ryan and Drew), all of whom went on to play Division 1 football and in Ryan's case the NFL. His 100m time ties him for 5th in the all-time standings.

Max Verboort represented the field events well by winning the long jump in a personal best leap of 21'0. His performance gives him a 2nd place all time ranking for the Wolves. The Eastern Washington football recruit is currently ranked 7th in state 4A.

Rachel Gough continued her winning ways by taking first place in the discus, the event where she set the school record last week, and which she is currently ranked 6th in state 4A. She also won the shot put with a personal best effort of 35-2. The Senior thrower who will compete at Southern Utah University next year is now ranked 4th on Eastlake's all time.

Emily Van Valkenburg, in only her second meet coming back from a months long injury, ran an impressive 3200m (11:20). Winning the event, she is currently ranked 6th in state 4A and led a sweep in the event for the Wolves which included, Ashley Lotzkar-12:01(PR) and sister Abbey Van Valkenburg-12:09 (PR)

Dawson Flaker also came up with gold winning the girls pole vault in a personal best effort of 9'9". She is now the 4th place vaulter in Eastlake history.

ADDITIONAL WINNERS FOR THE WOLVES INCLUDED:

Eva Hagwell...won the 400m for the second week in a row in a time of 60.20...currently ranked 8th in state 4A. In addition to anchoring the winning 4x200m, she also ran the final leg of the 1st place 4x400m which included Lauren McHugh, Erin Schmidlin and Quinto (4:14).

Regina Guest...hurled to a personal record for the second week in a row in the 100m hurdles (16.61) ...currently ranked 13th in state 4A.

Azita Balsara...in addition to her winning leg on the 4x200m won the 200m in a personal best time of 26.53...currently ranked 17th in state 4A. She also placed 2nd in 100m with a PR of 12.93.

Aaron Heiser...coming back from significant injuries the past few years won the 400m in a personal best time of 52.50. He also placed 2nd in the 200m in a personal record of 23.42.

Ethan Pederson...won the 3200m in a personal record of 9:499th all time for EHS. Led a sweep for the Wolves which included Owen Bloom (10:21) and Noah Zahn (10:23) PR.

Alyssa Flindt...won the 1600m in a personal record of 5:46...leading an EHS sweep which included Ella Hasselman (5:57) PR and Claire Wilson (6:11) PR
