BARRYSMITH TRIPLE WINNER

Caden Barrysmith did not allow the rain and wind that inundated the dual track meet against Juanita on Thursday May 27th to disrupt his stellar senior season. Impervious to the weather conditions, Barrysmith won three individual events. He opened the meet by winning the 100m in a time of 11.37 and then came back later to claim gold in the 200m (22.35). Saving the best for last, Barrysmith set a personal record in the triple jump mark of 43-95, which ranks second in the EHS history books and is currently the 4th best jump in 4A state rankings.

Azita Balsara continued to shine claiming gold in both the 100m (13.38) and the 200m (27.57). She also ran a leg on the winning 4x100m relay which included Regina Guest, Peyton Quinto and Abby Beckstead. Their 51.21 clocking puts the squad in 8th place in all time Eastlake rankings and currently ranks them in 4th place for state 4A.

Senior Rachel Gough also did not let the erratic weather damper her amazing season. For the third week in a row she claimed double victories by winning both the shot put and the discus. Her 36-02 effort in the shot put was not only a personal best, but it also gives Gough a 3rd place ranking in the Eastlake record books. She is currently ranked 7th in state 4A in the discus, the event that she set the school record for the Wolves in her debut a few weeks ago.
