Boys Basketball

LW Game....

Eastlake hit the road for the 2nd straight game to face the Lake Washington Kangs, a battle of the 2 unbeaten teams in the district. LW swept their series with the Juanita Rebels and were hosting a red-hot Wolves team. From the tip, Eastlake picked up where they left off vs Redmond, taking a 15-2 lead with only [2:30](#) left in the 1Q. Eastlake then stumbled coming out of a timeout, turning the ball over in 4 straight possessions. Kangs took advantage and scored 6 unanswered points, until **Cooper Brown** hit a 3 with no time left to close out the quarter, giving Eastlake an 18-10 lead. Both teams exchanged blows in the 2nd quarter, Kangs picked up the pressure and was able to force turnovers to stay in the game. Eastlake continued to hit from behind the arc in the 1st half, making 6 3pt FGs (**Cooper Brown** 3, **Owen Kinzer** 2, **Luke Wiljanen** 1). The 3rd quarter proved once again to be a strength area for the Wolves, coming out of the break on a 10-2 run. The Wolves finished the 3rd quarter holding LW to just 11 pts and had their highest scoring quarter with 20pts. The Kangs adjusted and came out in the fourth picking up full court, applying pressure to stay within reach, but the Wolves were too much and continued to get to the free throw line. **Will Woodward** scored 10 of his 13 points in the 2nd half with 10 rebounds and 4 assists, **Cooper Brown** finished with a game-high 20pts and **Owen Kinzer** added 12 points. On a bit of an off night, Eastlake managed to secure a 64-49 win against a tough Kangs team and remain the only undefeated team in the district. Coming off a GREAT 64-54 point victory in their home/season opener, it was time for the Eastlake Boys to hit the road for the backend of the home and home against long-time rival Redmond Mustangs. The games between the two programs are personal, these teams have been playing with and against each other for many years. Friendly, yet competitive chatter between games, it was known that Redmond wanted to get one back. In the early minutes of the game, it looked like the Mustangs were poised and ready to avenge their loss taking a 5-0 lead. The Wolves responded with a 7-0 run that ultimately led to a 13-2 run, which was just the beginning of a very HOT night for Eastlake. The team finished the 1st quarter with 31 points and holding the Mustangs to 20. The Wolves got out early, flying up and down the court, creating turnovers and getting fastbreak opportunities. The boys were hitting their shots too! Finishing with an incredible 10 3PT FGs made, just in the first half, as they took a 21-point lead into the half, 54-33.
