Track & Field

Van Valkenburg Sets Record at Oregon Relays

Twenty-Five of the Eastlake Wolves had the opportunity to travel to Eugene Oregon over the weekend to compete in the Oregon Relays which is held at Hayward Field, the US's premier track and field facility. Site of the World Championship Track and Field meet this summer, the

event brought in thousands of elite athletes from across the country to participate in the two-day meet.

Leading the way for Eastlake was Emily Van Valkenburg who placed 5th the 3000-meter Invitational on Friday evening in a time of 10:00.28. Battling with the leaders most of the race, Van Valkenburg, who will compete for Oregon State next year, smashed Pia Richard's school record by over 9 seconds. Richards, who is a distance runner at Washington State, ran a 10:09.93 at the Oregon Relays in 2016.

Two sets of sisters also scored points for the Wolves. Fiona and Claudia Wolf got the day off to a great start in the first race of the day by placing 2nd and 5th in the 2000m steeplechase. Fiona, the school record holder in the event, ran time of 7:26.65, while Claudia ran to a personal record with her time of 7:51.98. Shortly after the steeple, the Roos twins, Sally, and Jane, traded off leads with Kenzie Biegej from Camas throughout the Freshmen 3000m to end in 2nd and 3rd place. Their times of 10:27.09 and 10:27.18 now place them 4th and 5th on Eastlake's all-time list, surpassing Anastasia Kosykh who ran for UW.

The boys 3000m was also a race for the record books, with four guys breaking into the top 10 all time for EHS. Leading the way for the Wolves was Ethan Pedersen who narrowly missed Nate Pendleton's (who now runs for Washington State) record of 8:44.15. Clocking an 8:44.68, Pedersen is now ranked 2nd. Noah Zahn (8:59), Chris Lynn (9:23) and Daniel Montano (9:29) are now ranked 3rd, 5th, and 7th respectively.

The boys 4x800m (Connor Hom, Justin Hom, Zahn and Montano) ran a time of 8:16.36, coming within 2 seconds of the school record which is held by Ben Fixman, Kendrick Mitchell, Adamson Bryant and Nathan Pixler. Bryant and Pixler both ran Division I collegiately and Pixler is the school record holder in the 800m .

Other notable performances included:

*Connor Hom ran a personal best time in the 800m with a time of 1:57.20. He is now ranked 7th all time for the Wolves.

*Girls 4x800m (Alyssa Flindt, Erin Schmidlin, Ariya Mathrawal, and Sally Roos)-2nd all time.

*Girls Distance Medley (Jane Roos, Ava Hagwell, Fiona Wolf, and Van Valkenburg)- 3rd all time.

*Boys Sprint Medley (Bryson Hodges, Harry McHugh, Sean Clark, and Lynn)-3rd all time.

*Boys Distance Medley (Connor Hom, Clark, Justin Hom, and Pedersen)-4th all time.

*Boys 4x200m (Hodges, Kai Brown, Caden Cross and McHugh)-5th all time.

*Girls 4x100M (Mi-la Guest, Carly Preston, Peyton Quinto, and Sofia Robe)-9th all time.
