RELAYS REIGN SUPREME

Eastlake sprinters and middle-distance runners swept every relay in both the boys and girls division in their last home meet of the season against rival Redmond. The Wolves also celebrated Senior Night as 25 awesome student athletes participated in their Eastlake jerseys for the last time at home.

On the girls side, Abby Beckstead, Azita Balsara, Peyton Quinto and Ava Hagwell got the meet off to a great start by winning the 4x200m relay in an impressive time of 1:45.83, which gives them a 2nd place ranking in State 4A and a 4th all time for Eastlake standing. The sprint squad continued to impress by winning the 4x100m in 50.57. The team, comprised of Regina Guest, Balsara, Carly Preston and Abby Beckstead are now ranked 4th in 4A and 7th all time for EHS. Adding to the celebratory atmosphere, Quinto, Erin Schmidlin, Lauren McHugh and Hagwell took gold in the 4x400m relay in a time of 4:11. They are currently ranked 11th in the State and 8th all time for Eastlake.

Not to be outdone, the boys also claimed victory in both of their relays. Will Eaton, Aaron Heisser, Addison Barley and Caden Barrysmith won the 4x100m relay in a time of 44.06. They are currently the 10th ranked team in State 4A and 9th all time for EHS. Eaton, Sean Clark, Heisser and Lalit Bhimanandam took first in the 4x400m relay with a time of 3:42.4.

BARRYSMITH DOMINATES SPRINTS

Senior Caden Barrysmith had another impressive meet winning both the 400m and the 100m in addition to anchoring the winning 4x100m. His time of 50.80 in the 400m is currently the 3rd best time in State 4A and 9th all time for Eastlake.

Additional Sprinters who had exceptional performances included:

*Aaron Heisser...in addition to his two relay wins, also won the 200m (23.08) PR and placed second to Barrysmith in the 400m (52.20) PR. He is ranked 17th in the 400m and 19th for the 200m in the State.

*Ava Hagwell...anchored two winning relays and place 3rd in both the 400m (59.01) PR and the 200m (27.05) PR. Her 400m time gives her an 8th place ranking in the State and 4th all time for EHS.

*Abby Beckstead...besides her two relay wins, placed 2nd in the 100m (12.84) PR. The clocking currently ranks her 16th in State 4A and 5th all time for Eastlake.

*Will Eaton...ran legs on two winning relays and placed 2nd in the 200m (23.30) PR which is 17th all time for EHS.

*Addison Barley...besides running on the winning 4x100m relay, placed third in the 200m (23.75) PR to complete the Eastlake sweep in the event.

Senior thrower Rachel Gough continued her season long streak by winning both the shot put (38-09) and the discus (101-00), a feat that she has accomplished in every meet this season. Already the school record holder and ranked 7th in State 4A in the discus, the new personal record that she set in the shot put ranks her 4th in the state and 2nd all time for Eastlake.

Nicholas Heimbigner and Emma Lundin both threw exceptionally well with Heimbigner winning the javelin with a 15ft personal record. Lundin had a spectacular senior night throwing personal bests in both the shot put (23-07) and the javelin (67-00), claiming the runner up spot in both of the events.

BARRYSMITH FINISHES STRONG

Caden Barrysmith finished his Eastlake career in spectacular fashion at the LWSD Championship Track Meet that took place on Monday June 7th at Redmond High School. Winning gold in every event that he entered, Barrysmith convincingly left his mark in the Wolves record books. Starting his day by winning the 100m in a personal record time of 11.02., which is the 4th best time in the State 4A rankings and 5th all time for Eastlake, he went on to anchor the winning 4x100m relay. Joined by Will Eaton, Aaron

Heisser and Addison Barley, the team ran an impressive 44.06, which gives them a 10th place ranking in the State and a 9th place spot on the all- time list. He finished the day by winning two individual events: the 200m (22.28) and the triple jump (43-09). Despite the challenge of taking jumps before and after running the 200m, he still won both events handily. He finishes the season with 2nd and 4th place rankings in the 200m and triple jump respectively in the State and 2nd and 4th for the triple jump and the 200m in the Eastlake history books. Barrysmith will continue to compete this summer and will go on to compete collegiately next fall.

Thrower Rachel Gough finished her senior year for the Wolves by accomplishing a perfect season by winning both the shot put (38-02) and the discus (111-00) for the fifth week in a row. She leaves Eastlake as the school record holder in the discus (114-05) and the number two all time shot putter (38-09). Gough will take her talents to Southern Utah University next year where she will compete at the Division 1 level in the throws.

Junior Aaron Heisser continued his stellar year by winning the 400m in a personal record of 51.71, which is the 11th best time in State 4A. In addition to running a leg on the winning 4x100m relay, he wowed the crowd in his anchor leg of the 4x400m relay. Receiving the baton behind, he erased a 30m deficit to lead his team to victory. He was joined in the win by Eaton, Connor Hom and Sean Clark. Their time of 3:31.3 is the 4th best in the State this year and 12th on the Eastlake all time list.

Senior Regina Guest completed her perfect season by winning the 100m hurdles, a feat that she has accomplished in every other competition this spring. Saving the best for last, she set a personal record of 15.93, which ranks fourth in State 4A and 6th all time for the Wolves. Guest also ran the opening leg on the winning 4x100m relay. Joining her in the victory were teammates Azita Balsara, Carly Preston and Abby Beckstead. Their 50.07 clocking gives them a 4th place standing both in the State4A rankings and in the Eastlake history books.

Sophomore Eva Hagwell had an impressive day in what is to be considered to by the most difficult double in track and field; the 400m and the 800m. After running a personal best time of 59.01 and placing 4th in an extremely competitive field in the 400m, she went on to win the 800m in 2:20.10. She finishes the season with the 8th best time in the state in the 400m and the 9th best time in the 800m. She has the 4th best time in EHS history in the 400m and the 9th in the 800m. In addition, she anchored the 4x400m relay which included Peyton Qunito, Erin Schmidlin and Balsara. Placing second to a very good Redmond team. The squad established a 4th place ranking in both State 4A on the all- time EHS list.

Emily VanValkenburg ran negative splits to hit her fastest time of the season in her 3200m win. Her 11:00 clocking is the 4th fastest time of the season in 4A State standings.

Dawson Flaker ended her pole vault career on a high note by winning the meet and setting a big personal record of 10-03. She is now ranked 14th in the State and 12th all time for Eastlake.
