# WHAT IS THE PATHWAYS PRESENTATION?



THERE ARE SOME IMPORTANT STEPS IN THE CAREER EDUCATION JOURNEY THAT ARE BEST ADDRESSED IN YEAR 9-10 OR BEFORE

This Presentation has been designed to deliver the basics of Vocational Education and is generally targeted at Years 9 and 10 students.

We encourage self-awareness and job exploration during this one-hour presentation.

The object is to support students in their understanding of where they see themselves within the working world by introducing the key questions they should be considering at their Year level. We then introduce handy tools, like the Vocational Pathways to guide their explorations. We ensure students haven't missed vital information they need to successfully transition into senior Year levels.

The Pathways Presentation covers:

- Real-life scenarios through experiences of the facilitators
- Successes and learnings of the presenters themselves
- The basics of the education system - The difference between University, Polytech and Apprenticeship
- How to navigate the pressures of being asked, "what are you going to do when you leave school."
- Key questions to ask when thinking about pathway options at Year 9-10
- What subject selection is for and why is it important
- Tools such as the Vocational Pathways to support Job exploration
- Who the Careers staff are within school, and/or what Trade Academy is available to them
