



TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF SIGN CODE REGULATIONS FOR RESTAURANTS PROVIDING TAKEOUT OR DELIVERY SERVICES DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

The City of Rohnert Park is temporarily suspending certain provisions of the Rohnert Park Municipal Code relative to prohibited signs. The relief provided by this notice is temporary and may be withdrawn by the City at any time. The City intends to provide a 10-day notice of the termination of any such relief, although such relief may be withdrawn immediately should the needs of public safety dictate.

Effective immediately, the following types of signage are allowed, subject to the conditions listed within this announcement:

- Flag Signs, including “feather” type flags
- Portable Signs, including “A-frame” type signs
- Banners
- Signs placed on or attached to vehicles

Such signs are allowed only to establishments that have been determined to be essential per Order C19-03, Section (10)(f), issued by the Health Officer of the County of Sonoma, or by any subsequent or superseding order that is issued, and who are actively providing takeout and/or delivery services to the public.

Such signs shall not be located upon any sidewalk or other public right-of-way, shall not in any way interfere with visibility for drivers or pedestrians, and shall not interfere with internal parking lot circulation.

Businesses receiving takeout customers shall have a plan in place to minimize contact, and to prevent the clustering of customers in queuing lines, etc.
