

The Holy Spirit Moved Mightily at the 2019 Christian Men's Conference

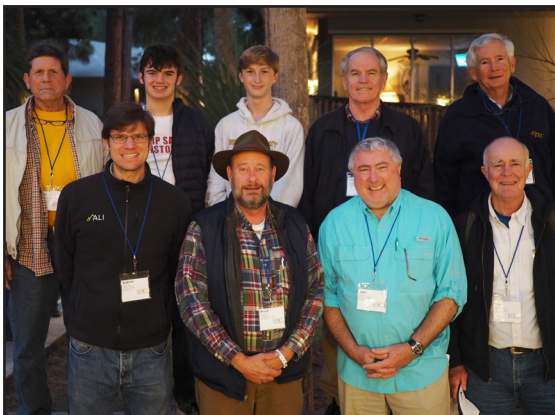
