Speaker: The Rev. Brian McGreevy

Brian McGreevy grew up in Charleston, graduated from Porter-Gaud, and then attended Duke University before earning a Bachelor of Arts with high honors from Furman University. At Emory University School of Law, he earned a Juris Doctor degree with honors in family law, and he earned the Fellow, Life Management Institute designation with distinction after completing a ten-course university-level program in financial services management.

Brian began his career in Atlanta with a world-renowned global trade association for the financial services industry, focusing on executive and management education. While still in his 30s, he was named to the firm's five-person management committee, overseeing a budget of over \$20 million and becoming the firm's youngest senior executive since its founding in 1924 in New York City. He directed the firm's international strategic

planning and oversaw its global expansion, opening joint ventures in London, Paris, Buenos Aires, Mexico City, Jakarta, Kuala Lumpur, Taiwan, and Beijing. He worked closely with the Ministers of Education in France, Indonesia, and Mexico and was closely associated with the US Ambassador to France, Pamela Harriman, as well as the US Minister for Commercial Affairs in the UK. He was featured on television in Argentina and Indonesia as a guest commentator on management excellence, and he served on boards of directors of industry associations in the US, Canada, and France.

Brian has co-authored, edited, and contributed to a number of university textbooks, including several in French, and one of these textbooks earned the highest honor for excellence as the most significant contribution that year to the academic literature of insurance and finance. He has served as featured speaker at conferences across the United States, as well as in Canada, France, Japan, Malaysia, Mexico, and the UK, sharing the platform with such experts as Harvard Business Review editor Rosabeth Moss Kanter, former US Attorney General Griffin Bell, and White House correspondent and media pundit Freddy Barnes.

Brian has served as a faculty member for several international executive development programs and worked closely with CEOs of a number of multi-billion dollar companies, including AXA and AIG. Upon leaving his position in management consulting, Brian returned to Charleston to begin a start-up venture with his wife Jane, whom he'd met through InterVarsity Christian Fellowship while at Emory University and married in 1983. Within two years of its founding, their business had received national recognition for excellence and was featured in several national magazines and on television. In 2007, Brian entered ordained ministry and served part-time at St. Philip's and as Chaplain at Porter-Gaud. In 2017, he joined St. Philip's full-time as Assistant to the Rector for Hospitality Ministry.

Brian and Jane have been blessed with four children and two grandchildren: Whit (an attorney in Charleston who is married to Mary Pat, parents of grandchildren Jackson and Mamie), Amy (a teacher in Greenville married to Michael Rabb, an attorney), Mary Hollis (a staff member for Sen. Lindsey Graham in Columbia), and Anne (a sophomore in the Honors College at the USC Moore School of Business).
