WEDNESDAY EVENING LENTEN SERIES 2017

"White Privilege: Let's Talk" is the curriculum we are using this year to examine the notion of privilege and look at structures we have created that impede fullness of life. This year's Lenten series will be a call to return to the Lord by using the theological lens of our Baptismal covenant in order to raise consciousness about racial privilege, acknowledge structural sin that allows it to perpetuate, and to repent of that sin.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

"The devotion known as the Way of the Cross is an adaptation to local usage of a custom widely observed by pilgrims to Jerusalem: the offering of prayer at a series of places in that city traditionally associated with our Lord's passion and death." (Book of Occasional Services, 2003)

This year, we have two options for walking the Way of the Cross—tile stations from Palestine/Israel which are installed in the main church, and images painted by artist Kathrin Burleson which are displayed in the south corridor.

Join us every Friday during Lent at 12:45pm in the main church for Walking the Way of the Cross.

Devotional materials will be available in the narthex and in the south corridor for anyone to use at other times during the week.

Baptism publicly proclaims something that is already true, that we are loved and claimed as God's own, that we are part of a larger family than the one into which we were born.

This year, our Baptismal preparation class for parents and godparents will be held on Saturday, April 1, from 9am – 1pm.
