FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK



COMMUNITY IMPACT SUCCESS STORY

United Way invests in programs in Macon, DeWitt, Moultrie, Shelby & Piatt Counties. There are success stories from every county. Here is "Jane's story" told by Moultrie County Beacon's Susan Rauch:

"Jane spent her days living on the streets. She was often seen in abandoned areas - any place she could find shelter for the night. She was known as the cat lady, a hoarder, and seen engaging in incoherent screaming fights with her fists drawn in the air - with someone who wasn't there.

Finally, someone noticed her, and an organization stepped up and took guardianship of her. She had a boyfriend who was physically abusing her, and taking what little money she had. Jane was not only being harmed...but was a harm to herself. She was in desperate need of help.

Someone knew of the Moultrie County Beacon, and decided that this was where she needed to be. Jane was dual diagnosed with a mental illness and a developmental disability. She now receives the monitored medication and counseling she so desperately needs.

Jane's transformation took over two years. She started out as a runner from her 24-hour home, screaming and arguing with imaginary people...was angry and abrasive.

NOW - Jane has lost weight, quit smoking, has a job at the Beacon, loves animals, and is a JOY to be around! The staff says she has become the "mother hen" with her housemates - a role she is proud of. But most importantly, Jane continues to evolve!"
