What is 211? 211 is an easy-to-remember telephone number assigned by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to streamline access to health and human services. 211 is a 24-hour hotline to connect residents to a wide variety of human services or social services.

If someone needs information or referral services but has little or no prior knowledge or experience, dialing 211 is much simpler than other options. Once a person dials 211, a professional Information and Referral specialist will then either refer or connect that caller to the correct agency based on the services needed. Callers to 211 can get LIVE assistance with needs such as: food, shelter, conseling, income supports, employment, healthcare, and services for specialized populations such as the elderly and persons with disabilities, and much more.

All calls are free, anonymous, and confidential.

If you or someone you know is in need and you are not sure how to help, call 211. This could be the first step towards changing someone's life in our community.

COMMUNITY IMPACT SUCCESS STORY

This story from Project READ Plus Executive Director Julie Pangrac is another example of impact in our community:

Jerome came to Project READ Plus because he wanted to improve his math in order to qualify for employment at a job that would allow him to provide for his family. He was on parole after having served more than 16 years in prison for crimes related to drugs and fighting. Jerome said, 'I did a lot of wrong, but I've learned my lesson, and now I have the drive to do right. But I'm here because I need your help.'

Jerome had dropped out of high school after 10th grade, 'and then I ran the streets,' he told us, adding that he got into a lot of trouble. While in prison, he obtained his high school equivalency diploma. 'But I can't score high enough on the math tests to get any good jobs,' he explained.

Jerome was matched with a tutor, and he attended sessions regularly, was always on time, asked questions, and completed his homework—all while he was working several part-time jobs. In a little over two months, he achieved the highest possible score on a national standardized test, and he had mastered decimals, fractions, percents, ratios, proportions, integers, and basic algebra. He had gained almost 5 grade levels. With new skills, he was soon employed by a local company and was earning more than minimum wage. Within 8 weeks, he was offered a permanent full-time position along with a raise.

Jerome attributed his success and increased confidence to Project READ Plus, helping him improve his math as well as his organization and time management skills. Jerome tells us that his life is changed, and he believes that having a job that allows him to be self-sufficient and independent will be instrumental in his not going back to prison. In addition, he is proud that he is a role model for his 7 children and 10 grandchildren.

Project Read Plus is a Decatur-area literacy program that helps adults change their lives. With one-on-one tutoring in reading and math, students gain skills to qualify for job training, complete post-secondary education, and gain certifications and degrees that lead to employment.

COMMUNITY INVESTMENT REPORT - MOULTRIE & DEWITT COUNTY

UWDMI completed its Community Investment Process in DeWitt and Moultrie counties for 2019-2021. This was the first year UW implemented the Common Community Approach (CCA) in these counties. The CCA is a systematic approach to move members of our community on a path towards self-sufficiency. This approach not only strengthens individuals, but also our community.

Investment recommendations were made by a panel of community volunteers. These volunteers rated each program based on its effectiveness, efficiency, and community integration. Community investment occurred in programs along four Lines of Effort (LOE): Youth Education; Adult Education, Job Skills Development, & Income Resilience; Health; and Safety. Investment was also made in Essential Service programs that linked individuals to Line of Effort programs.

The DeWitt and Moultrie County Community Investment volunteer panels did a great job investing in local programs that will definitely increase the capacity of individuals in our communities who are experiencing life challenges.
