

Books for a winter night

inter is a terrific time to snuggle into a comfy chair with a hot drink and a great book. Here are a few new titles we think you'll love, and we have lots more on our shelves!

** An epic, stunning novel about one family's search for the true meaning of home in the wake of disaster, **The Book of Fire* by Christy Lefteri (*The Beekeeper of Aleppo*), is a masterful work about the search for meaning in the aftermath of tragedy, as well as the universal ties that bind people to each other and to the land they call home. Musician Irini lives peacefully in an ancient Greek forest with her artist husband Tasso and their daughter, until a land speculator starts a small fire to clear a plot that accidentally sets the whole forest ablaze. Their home gone and Tasso's hands so badly burned that he can't paint, a distraught Irini stumbles across the speculator's body—what killed him is unclear—and makes a life-changing decision. \$29.99

** In her extraordinary debut work of historical fiction, *Wild and Distant Seas*, Tara Karr Roberts draws on Melville's *Moby-Dick* for a story of women with magical powers. Evangeline Hussey has a gift for reshaping the recent memories of those around her, which comes in handy when her husband is lost at sea and she's left managing a Nantucket inn. Then a restless sailor named Ishmael shows up, with whom she has an affair before he heads off to hunt for an infamous white whale. From there, the narrative unfolds from Nantucket to Boston, Brazil, Florence, and Idaho to visit four women touched by Evangeline's story. A must-read that can take its place alongside its inspiration. \$27.99

**** Lovers in Auschwitz** by Keren Blankfeld is the incredible true story of two Holocaust survivors who fell in love in Auschwitz, only to be separated upon

liberation and lead remarkable lives apart following the war—and then find each other again more than 70 years later. Zippi Spitzer and David Wisnia sustained their passionate relationship throughout their horrific stay in the death camp, but lost track of each other in the years that followed. Finally reunited with David after many decades, Zippi reveals a secret that had assured David's survival at the camp. An unbelievable tale of romance, sacrifice, loss, and resilience. \$30

** The Thefts of the Mona Lisa: The Complete Story of the World's Most Famous Artwork by historian Noah Charney tracks the eventful life of the Mona Lisa in a rollicking account that's both a thrilling tale of true crime and a rigorous work of art history. As Charney explores the fascinating history of the thefts of da Vinci's iconic painting, his meticulous research and engaging storytelling bring to life the audacious individuals who sought to possess the masterpiece for various motivations. He sheds light on the art world's underbelly and the mysterious allure of the Mona Lisa, making it a fascinating read for both art enthusiasts and those interested in true crime. \$32

** Bestselling novelist Alex Michaelides (*The Silent Patient, The Maidens*) returns with a new thriller, **The Fury**, in which a spontaneous trip to a private Greek island by a reclusive ex-movie star and her famous friends is marred by murder. Highly original, this utterly riveting story is told by an unreliable (to say the least!) narrator, a wonderfully drawn cast of characters with a motive to kill for, in a location to die for, and with enough twists and turns to keep you guessing until the shocking ending. \$28.99

A heartwarming bedtime story inspired by the Finnish Saami myth of the fox fires—the sparks that fly from the fur of a mystical fox to become the Northern Lights. 3-6 \$18.99

* Buffalo Fluffalo, Bess Kalb, Erin Kraan.
