2/15/19 Curriculum Morning and Anti-Bias Resources

We greatly appreciate the strong turnout of parents for the curriculum morning on Saturday. The 50+ adults in attendance, in addition to the 30+ students at the puppet show and craft activity, all found the morning to be fruitful and productive. Our curriculum presentations were ambitious. We worked to share curriculum topics including:

- geography the mapping of the earth and the study of people and place, history and story, similarities and differences
- traditional Montessori materials and lessons with a geography focus
- how our curriculum encompasses diversity
- what we have learned regarding anti-bias and how that is changing us as people and as teachers
- how we have revised materials and the curriculum with our anti-bias lens.

We were thrilled with all the support and interest from parents. While much of the discussion focused on race, we are also doing work in the areas of anti-bias regarding economic status, class, gender expression, sexual orientation, religion, learning differences, ableism, etc. Many parents were interested in how they could further their own learning in the area of anti-bias generally and "white privilege" specifically. We have several initiatives ongoing and just starting that are open to parents:
